

RNLI – House to house and Devizes Flag Day Collection: April 2012

Thank you everyone from Seend, Seend Cleeve, Martinslade and Bulkington for giving your time and effort to collect for the Life Boats. Here are the results. The figures in brackets show last years totals.

In the village, we collected £553.05 (£576.93) – 4% lower than last year but, considering one of our regular collectors was unavailable, this was a good result. The total house-to-house amount for all areas was £4564.71 (£4826.98) - 5% down on last year. The Flag Day in Devizes raised £923.53 (£1074.65) – down on last year by 14%.

The overall total (Flag Day and villages) was $\pounds 5488.24$ ($\pounds 5997.42$) – 8% down on last year. Although the figures are down on last year, these are very good results when we consider the weather on Flag Day and, in particular, the economic situation; many charities are noticing a fall in contributions.



Thank you once again, everyone, for another outstanding effort for a worthy cause supported wholly by charitable contributions.

What a wealth of things we've had to look forward to already this year, in the shape of our Queen's Diamond Jubilee. SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

By-election on Thursday 28 June 2012

An election has been called in the following electoral area: Seend Parish Council – one seat. Prospective candidates must meet the qualifying criteria to stand as a candidate and complete and return nomination papers by the statutory deadline. All the information on the qualifying criteria and all the necessary forms to complete are included in the nomination packs.

Nomination packs can be obtained from the Parish Clerk or from Wiltshire Electoral Services, Monkton Park, Chippenham, Wiltshire SN15 1ER.

Candidates must return their nomination papers to Wiltshire Electoral Services, Monkton Park, Chippenham, Wiltshire SN15 1ER during office hours Monday to Friday from Wednesday 23 May 2012 **but no later than NOON on Wednesday 30 May 2012**

The meeting held on **Tuesday 24th April** was attended by 9 Councillors with Mrs. T. Carr in the chair. Apologies received from Mr. Padfield.

Bus shelter, Sells Green – Mr Johnstone explained that he had recently moved into the new house built next door to Windsmere Stone in Sells Green, and that the current wooden bus shelter was, if fact, in his front garden. Whilst undertaking garden landscaping, it was obvious that the bus shelter was in a poor state of repair. Mr Johnstone said that he would be prepared to replace the current shelter with a brick shelter, on the same footprint, using materials left over from the building of his house. Councillors thanked Mr Johnstone for his kind offer; the Clerk to contact Planning Dept to ascertain whether planning permission was needed, and advise Mr Johnstone.

Allotments – The authorisation to commence work on the entrance to the allotments has now been received from Wiltshire Council (received 23rd April). Phil Dyke to be advised and a date obtained for the start of work.

Rusty Lane – Finger post received from Barkston Plastics, but post not yet received. Clerk to follow up.

Footpath SEEN4, Three Magpies – E-mail received from Stephen Matthews, Cleansing Technician on 5th April, still awaiting delivery of bin. The Clerk to follow up.

Rusty Lane, traffic speed – The signs had been collected by Paul Manning, but the wording on the smaller sign should have been on the larger sign, and vice-versa. Mr Manning to return them to Barefoot Signs for amendment.

Seend Shuttle – Mr Murch reported that there had been a lengthy delay in getting a quote for coachwork, because of changes in legislation. The Shuttle AGM will be held on 14th May, the representatives from the PC, Mrs Savage, Mr Murch and Mr Manning to attend if possible. Mr Diffey asked if the terms of reference will be discussed on 14th May, Mr Murch said they would, and would then be brought back to the PC.

Smiley SID – The metro count is now in place. Some Councillors felt that it is in the wrong place, but the Clerk explained that it could not be placed within 100 metres of the start of the 30 mph limit coming into Seend from the west, nor within 100 metres of the Bell crossroads.

Grange Farm, West Ashton - Response from Carol Hackett, Clerk at West Ashton PC, including copy of questionnaire to be circulated to parishioners in West Ashton. The current position is that Wiltshire Council has recently agreed planning permission for a wind measurement mast at this site. The mast will be erected to provide information on wind speed and intensity before a planning application is submitted by the energy company for three wind turbines. West Ashton Parish Council has not taken a formal view as yet, but indications suggest that Parish Councillors are unlikely to support the wind farm. West Ashton PC will be sending out the questionnaire in the next couple of weeks to all houses in their Parish asking for their opinion on the proposed wind farm, and there is also various information on the West Ashton PC website. *Bridge at Barge Inn* – E-mail received from Richard Leigh, Principal Waterway Engineer, to advise he has a meeting with the regional engineering team shortly and they will be discussing the bridge, and he will provide an update after the meeting. The Clerk to follow up if nothing received.

Telegraph Pole, Rusty Lane – The PCs comments had been passed to the utility company by Stuart Renfrew at Highways.

Parish/Neighbourhood Plan

Mr Murch reported that he had tried to convene a meeting to begin work, but it had not proved possible to get dates when everyone was available, but he would try to get it arranged as quickly as possible. The Clerk had forwarded an e-mail from Community First, who want to run an event "Supporting Communities and Neighbourhoods in Planning". To apply for the funding to run an event, they need to be able to show that they have seven communities who fulfil the criteria; a response was needed by 27th April. Councillors were all in favour of Seend PC attending.

Jubilee Celebrations

Mr Diffey reported that plans were proceeding well; he showed Councillors a sample of the mug purchased for the children of Seend, these will be distributed to the children on Friday, 1st June; also a leaflet that will be enclosed with Spotlight. A4 posters had also been produced and will be laminated and posted around the village nearer the date. There will also be a note in Spotlight outlining the various events. The church bells will be rung on Sunday 3rd June, and there will be a special service.

Planning Matters

E/11/1013/FUL Owls Corner, Martinslade

Extension and alterations to existing studio/bungalow to create separate self-contained dwelling

Councillors felt that the access is still not suitable, the reason Highways objected to the application last year. Councillors voted unanimously not to support this application.

E/12/0418/LBC	Old Wyatts, Row Lane
E/12/0417/FUL	Erection of single storey orangery & formation of new
	access. Removal of two trees.

Mrs Giles, owner of the property, was present at the meeting to answer any questions Councillors may have. Comments from Councillors included that they felt the design of the new orangery was not sympathetic to the character of the Grade II listed building, was too ornate and not in period; also that there was no indication why the two yew trees need to be removed. Mrs Giles stated that the trees were close to the house and made the kitchen dark, she also stated that she was prepared to replace the trees with mature specimens on another part of the site. A Councillor stated that the trees are close to the house, and could affect the structure, although it was unlikely that a house of this age would have foundations.

Councillors voted on the application in two parts. On the erection of the orangery, Councillors voted unanimously against the current design. On the removal of the two yew trees, Councillors voted 4 in favour, 4 against with 1 abstention.

E/12/0470/FUL 18 Dial Close

Single storey rear extension

It was pointed out that, on the plan, they had omitted to draw in the back door which is being kept.

Councillors voted unanimously in favour of this application

Bus shelter by The Lye – It was noted that dog walkers are putting dog mess in the bin that is located inside the shelter; this will make the shelter unpleasant to use, and could be a health hazard. A laminated notice to be placed inside the shelter, asking dog walkers to refrain from doing this, and the bin to be moved outside the shelter if possible.

Photovoltaic power generation – The application for a solar farm at Craysmarsh Farm was discussed, although this is in Melksham Without Parish. The application had not been circulated to Seend PC, although the site will have a visual impact for residents of Seend. Cllr Seed has spoken to the Councillor for Melksham Without, and this application has been called in to the Planning Committee. Mr Murch will attend to give the views of Seend PC.

Police Matters – The Community Beat Officer has advised that a white van, registration number SV51 JWL with the Homestyle Paving logo had been seen in the local area, and the occupants had been aggressive.

The date of the next meeting is **Tuesday**, 29th May 2012 at 7.30 pm in the Community Centre.

WILTSHIRE COUNCIL NEWS FROM JONATHON SEED

April was a busy month within Wiltshire Council with several initiatives coming to fruition. During April we saw the first school holiday in which school children were able to take advantage of the free swimming offer and what a difference that has made with some swimming pools seeing a 50% increase in children swimming compared to the same holiday period last year. That has to be good for the health of our children and for the pockets of our adults alike and it is good to see such a well received initiative. Also in April the Council launched its loan sharks initiative to try to reduce the threat to some of our most vulnerable families as well as launching the County Alcohol Initiative to improve awareness of alcohol related problems to individuals, families and communities. It would be good to receive feedback on these initiatives.

No major road schemes have been undertaken in the county since the Semington by-pass was opened in 2004. The cost of preparing a road scheme is very high but the development costs have to be spent before application can be made to government for inclusion in their funding programme. Such an application is a lottery where the other players are local authorities across the whole country. If government declines the scheme, the council has to write off a large sum of money with nothing to show for it and Wiltshire has rarely been at the top of the government's priority list. Now, however, government is proposing to delegate decision making on major transport schemes to local authorities working with Local Enterprise Partnerships. In our case that is the Wiltshire and Swindon LEP. That means that after 2015, some money will be available each year for us to share with Swindon. It may not be enough to upgrade our entire network immediately, but at least we can be confident of doing something in our County.

As I write we have just celebrated the visit of Her Majesty the Queen to the Wiltshire Diamond Jubilee event in Salisbury Cathedral Close on Tuesday 1st May. What a superb expression of Wiltshire loyalty to the Queen that event was and how brilliantly the staff of Wiltshire Council performed in setting it all up and delivering the impeccable display in appalling weather conditions right up to the moment when Her Majesty arrived and the sun came out to match that very special smile. The Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh were on great form and met literally hundreds of Wiltshire folk and showed great interest in the display of Wiltshire life. Spotlight continues to bring us all the news from Seend and Bulkington, and I look forward to joining in the Diamond Jubilee events in the village, culminating in the beacon lighting, and the Village Fete.
