WILTSHIRE COUNCIL'S CABINET HAS AGREED THE NEXT STEPS FOR THE PROPOSED A350 MELKSHAM BYPASS.

The project was the subject of an initial consultation and engagement exercise on a long list of indicative route options. After considering the feedback, Cabinet has agreed that the project can move to the next stage, a second non-statutory consultation and engagement exercise on a shortlist of options. The focus of the shortlist is Option 10c, the long route to the east of the town, and various alignments at the northern end of the proposed bypass. The forthcoming consultation will also look at improving cycling and walking facilities along the route. We'll be releasing more details soon on how people can have their say on the proposals ahead of the consultation launch at Melksham Area Board. CHRISTIAN AID WEEK 2021 - May 10th - May 16th

The usual emergencies have continued this year in the poorer countries, but the focus there, as in the UK has been more on the pandemic, especially in Brazil and India. In much of Africa, it is still a largely a problem to come for which they are preparing with woefully inadequate resources due to limited health services, such as hospital beds, not to mention vaccines as well as the extra protection needed to care for those who do find a hospital bed. The other area of development that has become more important this year is dealing with climate change. Whilst we need to think about greener heating in the home and personal transport the effects on the poorer countries are more immediate and basic. Our weather is gradually becoming more extreme but in the poorer world the weather which was already experiencing more extreme fluctuations than ours has become even worse. Parts of Africa and Asia that used to have occasional drought when the annual rains failed and floods when the rains were prolonged have recently experienced both more droughts and floods. And droughts mean hunger for some whilst floods deprive others of their homes as well.

Given the problems that many have faced in this country with the pandemic and the decline in house to house collections by charities nationally we were not too optimistic about the success of this year's collection. It is therefore very encouraging to be able to report that our collection in Seend and Bulkington raised £1,515.80, comfortably the highest total so far. Thanks to everyone who contributed so generously. Thanks also to everyone who was able to gift aid their contributions. Christian Aid will claim a further £181.30 on all of the gift aided contributions, increasing the total amount from the Christian Aid Week in Seend and Bulkington to nearly £1700. Thanks also to those who were away during the week or did not have money when our collectors called and handed an envelope into the Village Shop or to my bungalow. This added nearly £100 to the total.

Particular thanks to the collectors who generously give of their time each year, all of whom have volunteered before and most for a number of years. Many of the team once again on the same rounds making it a more familiar and sociable exercise for everyone involved. Thanks especially to Anne, Hilary, and Ruth who all increased their rounds because two collectors were not available this year. Thanks also to Jerome and his staff for happily allowing the Shop to act as a collection point.

Spotlight, as always, gave us a flying start in terms of informing everyone and inserting 720 envelopes into the magazine. It makes it so much easier for contributors to prepare in advance, especially completing the Gift Aid slip, whilst those on holiday in Christian Aid week can return their envelopes before departure or on their return.

We look forward with confidence to raising money for Christian Aid in 2022, May 15th. -21st. House to house collections may be on the wane nationally but it still works well in rural areas such as ours, where the community is strong.

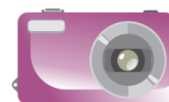

The first three weeks brought photos of roses, views from lockdown walks and children's crafting, baking and growing things. The next categories are:

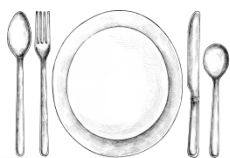

For some reason, some search engines still bring up the old website (green background), even though our domain name is no longer pointing to it and therefore it is no longer live.

Planning Applications – Just a reminder that all planning applications in the Parish are put on the planning page of the PC website until the deadline for comments has passed. The status of planning applications for 2020 and 2021 are also listed, ie decision is either approved, refused or still pending.

Sandridge Solar Community Benefit Payment - Each year, Seend Parish Council receives a community benefit payment from Foresight Group who are responsible for managing the Sandridge Solar Farm. It is usually in the region of £1,000 to be spent on something to benefit the community. This money has paid for the 3 defibrillators and their cabinets, renovating the benches, the purchase of two new noticeboards and a contribution towards the repainting of the Church clock. We are now looking for ideas for what this year’s money could be spent on. We already have two suggestions, but are looking for others. The payment is not made until the autumn. Please email the clerk if you have any suggestions. They can then be discussed at a future PC meeting.

Townswork – Priority for People - Townswork are undertaking an exercise called “Priority for People” on behalf of Melksham Town Council, to explore how people in the town and surrounding villages move around – covering movement of people, goods, vehicles as well as bicycles, public transport and on foot. This exercise follows on from the report “Melksham 2020-2036. The objective is to prepare a movement strategy as a starting point for change over the next 15 years to create a cleaner, safer and healthier town. Rev Ali writes.... This month Revd. Joshva John and his family will be leaving the vicarage in Seend to move on to new adventures! We are thankful for his ministry and the time he has spent with us here. Joshva's last service will be at Seend at 10am on 4th July. On behalf of all our communities we wish Revd. Joshva, Rachel, Angeline and Jessica every blessing and send our love and continued prayers.

"I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now ... (Philippians 1:3-5, NIV)

A message from Revd. Joshva..... Greetings. It was a great joy to serve the Wellsprings Benefice for the past three years alongside the Oxford Centre. I would like to say "A BIG THANK YOU" to all of you for your kind support and encouragement during my ministry here. I have received a number of emails expressing sadness in my leaving while appreciating what I am going to do. I had to say sorry to those whose expectations were not met during my ministry. People seem to have enjoyed my best and worst sermons. Some could not hear me and some complained while others did say we enjoyed your singing, your jokes, your sermon points. You had accepted me with my Indian accent and tuned yourself to my services. You have also shown a generous reception to my family and my daughters. As many of you may know Rachel is teaching at the Wiltshire College, Salisbury and so we are moving to Salisbury. Jessica will be studying one more year at Lavington School and then will move to one of the schools at Salisbury. I could not do two jobs together and thus I have to focus on one job.

As many of you know, I worked at the Oxford Centre for Religion and Public life, which is part of the academic arm of Barnabas Funds, as a Dean and an Associate Director. We grew up to ten full-time staff with many PhD, Postgraduate and Undergraduate studies and students around the world. It was humbling for me to serve the church and the centre at the same time connecting theological education while relating to real people in the church. I have decided to move from academic to real Bible based training work. At the Oxford Centre, I was working with a motto of "Theology for All" campaign and thus networked many theological networks around the world and supported them during the pandemic. From September I will be joining the Bible Society in Britain as the Head of International Bible Advocacy Centre with a campaign, "Bible for All". This job provides me opportunity not only to serve the countries around the world in terms of promoting training on reading Bible in everyday life. We will also promote training for church and lay leaders to encourage young people in the United Kingdom and in Europe to read the Bible and relate the stories to their jobs, their day-to-day affairs and their challenges in public and private life. We will also provide training to communicate the Bible stories through various art and music. I will lead a team of people in this centre. It is humbling that they have selected me for this great opportunity to serve God and serve the worldwide people of God. Please pray for me and my family as we are taking this endeavour.

Once again I am thankful to God for giving me an opportunity to serve all the five churches. I thank God for my colleagues, lay ministers, Wardens, committee members, and all the members and helping hands in all these churches for your extraordinary support to me, my family and my ministry here. I am grateful to all the neighbours and friends at Seend who were helpful and friendly to us. I go with two points – regardless of who one is, one is welcome, respected and appreciated in this place; people have often trusted clergy and frankly spoke to us even if it means to improve us. I am also thankful for the generosity of hospitality shown to me during my visits within the benefice. I hope to leave my jokes as many of you might have realised that I am running out of jokes or repeating some.

I will continue to pray for all in the Wellsprings Benefice especially for the ministry team and all who support ministry in different ways. We will certainly miss this place and yet you will be part of my history that I will continue to share our stories around the world. It was indeed a great privilege to take a small group to pray for the whole world with speakers from different countries. As I move, please remember such people and their ministries as well. I leave you with this great motto of my life that I have taken from a great missionary, William Carey. Expect Great Things from God and Attempt Great Things for God. When he left his parish in Northampton he told his congregation please hold the other end of the rope in prayer while I get down to save the one who is struggling in the deep water catching the other end of the rope. Please remember me as one of your household members who is going to serve the wider world leading many to return to God by reading the Bible. Your prayers and support for our future ministry will be gratefully appreciated. Each one of you will be remembered in our daily prayers. God bless - Joshva, Rachel, Angeline and Jessica.

It's been a year like no other, COVID-19 has taken the world as we once knew it and changed it forever. We've lost loved ones and gained new ways of living, connecting with friends and family digitally and working from home where possible. We've seen community groups form to look out for each other and in our own very small village some of our residents who took it upon themselves very early in the pandemic to take on the role of supporting those in need, and we thank them all for their commitment and support they have provided and continued to provide throughout the pandemic. Thank you.

The Parish Council Team has seen a lot of change in the past 12 months too, with a high number of resignations from long standing positions. We'd like to thank those who have since moved on, for their contribution to the parish over their period in Councillor role. However, this movement of Councillors has enabled a new team to form and despite spending most of the year virtually connecting and getting to know each other, has achieved good team morale and equal split of responsibilities and workloads. The 2021 election also created the opportunity for the final place on the

With that I'd personally like to thank the support I have received from ALL of the current Councillors and the Parish Clerk in the role I have held since the resignation of the previous chairperson. I've held the acting Chairperson position since August 2020, and with the support of the Councillors and Hannah we have managed to maintain the services, achieve some goals and set in motion a new way of working with the community, here are some of our highlights for me this year;

- All our governance documents are now up to date and available on the website.
- Our Clerk has been given a contract of employment and a representative pay scale, thank you to Simon and Julie for supporting this work.
- The 2019 bonfire site was cleared when we knew the 2020 bonfire event wasn't going to happen, making the Recreational Ground tidy and free from debris. Thank you Simon, Nicki & Alex.
- The village quarterly Newsletters keeping the community connected with what we do and how to get more involved. Thanks to the Team for helping with content ideas and volunteering their time to help distribute these.
- We successfully received £2500 from Melksham Area Board in September for the new equipment in the Recreational ground.
- Our recreational ground has had unsafe equipment removed and replaced with a new Climbing tower.
- Our grass maintenance contract has been refreshed and renewed with Idverde to meet the expectations of the villagers who wish to use the grounds for ball sports. Thank you Andrew for negotiating with the contractor on this.
- We have a new community website with fantastic collaboration with Sue for community content and the Parish Council are now self-managing Parish Council pages, removing the burden of maintenance from Sue & Calum. I've learnt a new skill in creating a website and moving data from the old site to the new one.
- We've removed payroll costs from David Owen Accountants and brought them in house, thank you Andrew for taking on this role and helping remove some costs from our annual Precept.
- All stiles on our footpath network have been repaired by the land owners, thank you Alex for working with the other land owners on getting this sorted.
- Dog fouling continues to be a problem in the village despite the additional bins we installed. We are supporting land owners who have informed us of problems with

providing extra penalty notices for their fences. Thank you Julie for making this happen. We continue to explore ways to improve this and welcome any input from residents.

- The Recreational Ground Committee has been reformed and with the dedication of some of the Council Team (Alex & Andrew) there has been significant improvements made to the upkeep of the grounds, with more still to come from the new Committee. Thank you to Carla and the members of the Recreational Ground Committee for stepping up and wanting to be part of this.
- The new Recreational Ground Committee successfully secured £1000 funding from Melksham Area Board for the smaller maintenance jobs needed in the Recreational ground which gave the new Committee a financial start along with a very generous donation from Councillor Andrew Grabham and another donation from a former resident. Well Done Carla on securing funding to kick start the Recreational Ground Committee.

We look forward to a new year ahead where meeting in person will eventually become the new norm and we can resume our meeting in the Village Hall supporting this wonderful facility. We have made a request to the Village Hall Committee to consider an internet connection so that despite we as a team meeting physically again every month we can continue to invite those who wish to attend by digital means can continue to do so. Therefore, making our meetings more accessible to all those who cannot physically attend due to childcare arrangements, physical abilities or just prefer being in their own homes while still playing a part in their village community. We will continue to pursue this option and will keep the community informed on how our meetings can be attended.

We have consulted the community on a large topic of the Precept over the last quarter of this financial year and we will inform the community of the responses in due course when we've had time to review the data. We're really excited about the possible opportunity to create a Recreational Ground for the whole community and not just the children, making it a space everyone can benefit from.

Financial;

At the time of writing, the Parish Council's accounts for 2020/2021 have not been finalised, we are also in the process of changing our accounting services.

The Precept setting for 2021/2022 was kept to a minimal increase to cover general increase in costs for the day to day running of the Parish.

Thanks to Jonathan Seed who has supported Bulkington Parish Council for many years, but now due to the boundary changes Jonathan is no longer our local Councillor. We welcome Tamara Reay as our Devizes Rural West Councillor and we look forward to getting to know Tamara more as we build a new supportive network with Devizes Rural West.

I also thank Calum and Sue for their support and work on the old website for the past 10 years and look forward to working more closely with Sue on the content and

community engagement with the new website and Sue's ongoing work on the various FaceBook pages.

We look forward to working more closely with our community over the next 12 months and we welcome you all to attend our meetings to come and find out more about what we get up to and how you can get involved.

SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

NB. The following minutes are a shortened version of the full minutes taken at the Parish Council meeting on 25th May 2021. These have not yet been ratified by the Parish Council and may be subject to change. A full copy of the minutes can be found on our website: www.seendparishcouncil.co.uk

The meeting held on 25th May was attended by seven Councillors with Mr James in the Chair, Mrs Sue Bond (Clerk), Councillor Tamara Reay. There was one apology.

Local Councillor Matters – The Chairman welcomed to the meeting Councillor Tamara Reay, our newly elected County Councillor representing Devizes Rural West. Councillor Reay said that she was honoured to have been elected to the new ward Devizes Rural West. She looked forward to working positively with all the parishes and hopes to find out about our most pressing issues and to agree how she can best represent Seend Parish at Wiltshire Council. She said that she had been appointed Portfolio Holder for Climate Change. **Melksham Bypass** – following the public consultation and the preparation of their report based on the public response, Wiltshire Council were presenting their recommendations to the Cabinet meeting on 1st June.

Minutes & Matters Arising: Minutes of the meeting held 27th April were approved.

Highways - Devizes CATG – The Chairman said that he and the Clerk had listened in to the meeting on Teams. We had one Highway Improvement Request on the agenda that had transferred from Melksham to Devizes CATG – the request to have a high friction surface painted on the A361 at the crossing point between Inmarsh Lane and Spout Lane. The recommendation from the Highways Engineer (Melksham CATG)

was that a pedestrian warning sign on the outbound direction where visibility was poorest would suffice rather than the high friction surface. The Devizes Highways Engineer concurred with this recommendation. The Chairman asked what the cost would be for a high friction surface to be painted on. The Highway Engineer said that it would cost in the region of £2,000 on top of the £600 for the sign. Councillors discussed the merits of having just the sign as opposed to having both sign and high friction surface. The majority of Councillors felt that the high friction surface would make the crossing more visible. The Clerk said that we would need to check what contribution the Parish Council would need to pay, whether it was 25% or 50%. The Clerk was asked to check this. **Metro Count, High Street**. Following last month's meeting, a site visit was made by councillors to agree a location. The Clerk sent in a Traffic Survey Request. It is unlikely that the metro count will take place until the autumn as there is a back log due to traffic surveys being suspended during the pandemic. **Bus Shelter, top of Bollands Hill** - The Clerk had got a quote from a company GW Shelter Solutions for a replacement shelter. She was told that rather than replacing the whole shelter, the company could replace just the damaged parts at a cost of £2,657 ex VAT. She suggested that the PC could apply for an Area Board grant to help with the cost. Councillor Reay asked why, if the PC did not own the shelter, were they having to pay for its repair. The Clerk explained that she had asked Wiltshire Council if it could be repaired when the damage occurred following a traffic accident and was told that there were no funds to do so. She offered to speak to Wiltshire Council on our behalf. Councillors were happy for her to do this. Another Councillor suggested it might be worth investigating whether it could be straightened by a panel beater and he offered to investigate this. **Resolution:** it was proposed by that we apply for an Area Board grant, and then depending on this and the outcome of all avenues of investigation to discuss again at the next meeting. This was seconded and all Councillors voted in favour.

Police Matters - Mrs Heatley said she had heard that the reason she had not been receiving monthly incident reports was because there had not been enough manpower to do them due to the pandemic, but that it was hoped that this would resume shortly. PC Richards and PC Shorah conducted speed checks in Seend High Street on 7th May.

Incidents: There has been a report of a vehicle being taken off the road for having no insurance. Another report of three motorbikes riding around a field with livestock in it behind the Community Centre and another report of two young males on electric scooters riding fast on the canal towpath from Bowerhill towards Seend. **Action**

Fraud: When booking a holiday, check whether the company is an ABTA member by looking for the ABTA logo on the company's website. Neighbourhood Plan – Mrs Bear said that the Neighbourhood Plan was now 'Made' and was a statutory document that Wiltshire Council would have to use. She hoped to

get some hard copies printed and asked Mrs Vince to investigate prices for printing a number of copies, but would delay actually printing them until six weeks after the Referendum result announcement when there is an opportunity for people to object to the result. The Chairman thanked Mrs A'Bear and the Steering Group for the tremendous amount of work undertaken to complete the Neighbourhood Plan.

Planning Matters

Proposal: Reuse of existing property as new office accommodation falling within Class E to the Schedule to the Use Classes Order, and without complying with condition No 2 imposed on application 15/00937/FUL.

Resolution: Mrs A'Bear and Mr Lack declared an interest and did not vote. All other Councillors agreed that this application should be opposed. (Please see full minutes on website for reasons.)

Application Ref: PL/2021/03225 and PL/2021/04611 (LBC) Seend Park High Street, Seend SN12 6NZ

Proposal: Proposed single storey rear extension to listed stable block. Provision of new garden wall, terrace and swimming pool to curtilage.

Resolution: Mr Lack and Mr Wiltshire declared an interest and did not vote. All other Councillors voted in favour of the application being approved subject to the archaeologist's recommended conditions being placed on it.

Application Ref: PL/2021/04913 - 3 The Lye, Seend SN12 6PA

Proposal: Holly tree - fell because of excessive size and over-reaching to path. Replant flowers and possibly a magnolia tree in the same area.

Resolution: All Councillors voted in favour of the application being approved.

Application Ref: PL/2021/05203 - Manor Field, High Street, Seend SN12 6NU

Proposal: 4 x Beech trees - crown reduce 30%.

Resolution: All Councillors voted in favour of the application being approved.

Application Ref: PL/2021/05207 - Manor Field, High Street, Seend SN12 6NU

Proposal: Cedar tree - crown raise 2m & shape Ash tree - remove branch overhanging shed 2 x Horse Chestnut trees - crown raise 4m Maple tree - crown raise 4m.

Resolution: All Councillors voted in favour of the application being approved.

Statement of Accounts – Following the corrections made following last month's meeting, the Councillors were happy to approve the Statement of Accounts as prepared by our Accountants, DCK Accounting.

Annual Governance and Accounting Return – The Clerk explained that because the Parish Council's income and expenditure was under £25,000 for 2020-2021, they could exempt themselves from having an external audit. The Clerk explained that there would still be an internal audit carried out and this was currently ongoing. All Councillors voted in favour of exempting themselves from the external audit.

The AGAR: Governance Statement and Accounting Statement were formally approved in that order. The Chairman and Clerk signed both forms. These will be published on the website.

Financial Matters – Bank reconciliation to end of April £34,785.66

Date of Next Meetings - The next Parish Council meetings are 29th June and 27th July.

I am delighted to have been elected as the Wiltshire Councillor for Devizes Rural West - as you may know Seend and Bulkington are now part of the Devizes Rural West division, along with seven other parishes across the area, and along with Poulshot have moved from the Melksham Area Board to the Devizes Area Board.

A little about me – I have worked in the Devizes area for a number of years, as Chief of Staff for Claire Perry, and then for Danny Kruger MP. Early in 2020 I led the bid for Devizes Gateway rail station to the Department for Transport's (DfT) "Restoring your Railway" fund. We were delighted that the Devizes bid was successful in the initial bidding round, and since then I have worked on behalf of the Devizes Development Partnership with the Wiltshire Council transport team to develop a strong, initial feasibility study. The business case will shortly be submitted to the DfT, and we will have everything crossed in anticipation!

Over the last few months, I have enjoyed exploring the communities of Devizes Rural West as I have leafleted and door knocked across the area. I also joined Parish Council meetings by Zoom, which gave me a good understanding of local issues and concerns.
