CHURCH NEWS

Maureen's ramblings.....

One of the things that fascinates me about the Gospel accounts of Jesus' resurrection is the reaction of the disciples. Jesus had told them that he would rise from the dead. The women who had gone to the tomb showed them that the tomb was empty. Mary Magdalene shared with them that she had "seen the Lord". But the disciples didn't get it. They couldn't believe it. Two disciples even left Jerusalem - miserable and downcast – thinking that Jesus' ministry had ended in failure.

What had happened to them is what happens to us. Jesus' death and resurrection were history and life changing events – but nothing had actually changed. For the disciples, the world was as awful as it had ever been. The oppressive Romans were still in power; the peace and prosperity they thought the Messiah would bring seemed as far off as ever. Christ's resurrection should transform the world – but it hadn't. Where is the resurrected Christ in the continuing suffering of the world?

If Christ's resurrection is true – we want it to change the world. How is it changing things in the Ukraine, in Syria, in the Yemen? How is it changing things for the poor and oppressed, the hungry and the refugee? How do we celebrate Easter in a Good Friday world, when the very last thing that anyone wants to be told, in the face of all that is in our news headlines, is 'be happy, Jesus is risen from the dead'?

I have been a follower of the risen Christ for over 50 years and constantly have to reflect on the reality and purpose of my faith. I don't have a simple or a blind faith — but one that always struggles with finding truth, finding God, in the dark and empty places. My current reflections lead me to think that what we need to learn is how to live the resurrection, not in a world made suddenly easy and peaceful by the events of Easter Day, but in a world wounded by humanity and fractured by heartache and sorrow.

The risen Christ comes to us as he has always come, bringing into our broken, grieving world the gentle but persistent reminder that, in the words of Desmond Tutu: 'Good is stronger than evil; love is stronger than hate; light is stronger than darkness; life is stronger than death.' Jesus doesn't ask us to feel joyful (although I hope I will on Easter Day!) – but to hold on to the fact that this is true and to seek, wherever we can, to be and do good; to be loving; to bring light into the darkness and to be life-giving to all we meet. In fact – to be Easter people in a Good Friday world. Easter people who have hope for the future; Easter people who believe, sometimes with tears in our eyes – that forgiveness, healing, reconciliation, peace, justice - all of it is possible. And so we can proclaim –"Christ is risen! Alleluia!.

Draft Minutes of the Bulkington Parish Council Meeting PENDING APPROVAL

28/22 **Apologies for absence:** Amy Powell, PCSO Janet, Tamara Reay (Conservative Councillor for the Devizes Rural West Division) and Carla Haslam

29/22 **To Record**: No changes to the Register of Interests were declared

No interest in Agenda Items was declared

30/22 To Receive a report from PCSO Janet and Tamara Reay

Tamara Reay: The following report was received:

The Devizes Area Board met on Monday 7th March. The changes to residual waste collections (black bins) will save the Council £400,000 pa in efficiencies. Subsequently residents will be aware that industrial action by Hills Waste (GMB Union) has resulted in difficulties over the past few days in lorries being unable to leave depots, and as a result the Council has taken the difficult decision to prioritise residual waste collections and therefore suspend recycling collections until 21 March. It should be noted that UNISON employees have agreed to the revised pay deal offered by Hills – initially 2% last year and this was revised to 7% over two years (2% in Oct 2021 and a further 5% from March 2022). This is certainly not unreasonable given public sector pay increases are currently averaging around 2.5%.

PCSO Report to follow separately once received. No PCSO updates to share from

PCSO Report to follow separately once received. No PCSO updates to share from the minutes from last Area Board meeting yet as it was on the 7th of March.

- As a police force, we cover the whole county, across both local authority areas for Wiltshire Council and Swindon Borough Council.
- The county is divided into eight Community Policing Teams (CPTs).
- Each team is led by an Inspector and made up of designated Response and Neighbourhood officers.
- Each CPT has five Response Teams with each one being led by sergeants. The main role of these officers is to do investigations.
- Each CPT has a Neighbourhood Team. In Swindon this is divided into three areas. These are led by an Inspector and made up of sergeants, officers, Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs), volunteers and police staff.
- Our Neighbourhood Teams play a valuable role as the main link between the Force and the community. They are the officers and volunteers you will come to recognise in your communities and will see at local meetings and events.
- Our neighbourhood officers focus directly on working within the community, offering greater contact with the public and take a problem-solving approach to local community issues. Your Community Policing Team

We continue to work hard to embed our neighbourhood officers within the town and parish communities and we are working to respond to 999 and 101 calls and manage ongoing to raise awareness of these teams and how the public and partners can best engage and communicate with them.

Annual Parish Meeting

The Annual Parish Meeting will be taking place on 5th May at 8pm at the Irene Usher Memorial Pavilion. Refreshments will be available from 7.30pm. This is a public meeting and all parishioners are invited to attend. Seend clubs and organisations are especially invited to give a short report on their year's activities. Please let the Clerk know if you are wishing to give a report. If you cannot attend, but would like to submit a report to be read out on your behalf, then please send it to the Clerk.

Please note, we will be holding the Annual Parish Council meeting on the same evening, but at the earlier time of 7pm. We will elect chairman and vice chairman at this meeting and re-adopt some of the constitution documents. This should be a short meeting as there will not be any other council business at this meeting. But members of the parish are still welcome to attend.

Both agendas will be put on the PC website a week before the meeting.

Platinum Jubilee Tree Planting – There has been some discussions on the Village Facebook page about planting trees to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee (the "Queen's Green Canopy" project). Back in 2018, the Parish Council tried, but failed to find a location in the Parish to plant 25 trees to commemorate each of the 25 Seend soldiers who died in WW1. Therefore the Parish Council has been a little reluctant to take a lead in any major tree planting project in the Parish to mark the Platinum Jubilee.

However, as there has been some interest expressed by parishioners willing to plant trees on their land, the Parish Council will consider purchasing and supplying a number of trees for parishioners. There would obviously be an upper limit on the number of trees we can afford to buy. These will be purchased from The Woodland Trust and will be fairly small saplings. https://www.woodlandtrust.org.uk/.../queens-green-canopy

We just need to know the level of interest from the Parish, before committing to the purchase. It could be from landowners who want to plant a few trees or individuals who want to plant a single tree. Please email the Parish Clerk to register your interest and the number of trees you would like (and type if you have a preference). Responsibility for the trees and their on-going maintenance will be down to the landowner.

It would be good if we can get at least 70 new trees planted in the parish, one to mark each of the years the Queen has been on the throne!

NEWS FROM WILTSHIRE COUNCIL

Help with rising energy costs

Almost all of us will be affected by the current increases in energy costs and I was pleased that in February, the Government announced that all households in England whose primary residence is in council tax bands A to D are entitled to a one-off council tax energy rebate payment of £150.

To ensure that residents get the payment as soon as possible Wiltshire Council will be using the details of those who are set-up to pay by direct debit so that the rebate money can go straight into those accounts. The council is in the process of establishing how the money will get to those people who aren't set up to pay by direct debit, and more information for those residents and how they can claim it will be available in due course.

The Government also announced that funding will also be provided to local authorities to operate a discretionary fund for households in need who would not otherwise be eligible. This could include, for example, individuals on low incomes who live in properties in bands E-H. Wiltshire Council has been allocated around £877,000 for this and is developing a system to distribute this money to those eligible and will confirm more details soon. There was more good news for vulnerable households who will be able to benefit from energy efficiency improvements over the next year. Together with Swindon Borough Council, Wiltshire Council has secured over £5 million to deliver home energy upgrades across Swindon and Wiltshire, following a successful bid to the Government's Home Upgrade Grant fund. The funding will be used to install energy efficiency measures in homes to raise Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) rating to Band C. Households, including social rent, low income and living in areas without mains gas - both rented and owner-occupied - will benefit from these improvements helping to reduce their bills and make their homes warmer. Upgrades include wall and roof insulation as well as new low-carbon heating systems, thermostats and room heating controls.

I'd encourage anyone who is concerned about rising energy bills or who need energy saving advice, to contact the free and impartial Warm and Safe Wiltshire service at warmandsafewiltshire.org.uk or by calling 0800 038 5722. Meanwhile, I am very aware that across Devizes Rural West there are residents living in older social housing with particularly inefficient heating systems, and as your Wiltshire Councillor, and with responsibility for Climate Change across the county, I am working to secure improvements.

SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

February PC Meeting

<u>Attendance</u> – 8 Councillors: Apologies: Jackie Hamblin, John Williams and Councillor Tamara Reay.

Local Councillor Matters – A report was read out by the clerk.

Melksham Bypass - Wiltshire Council has agreed to delay the submission of the Outline Business Case for the Melksham bypass until the Summer, whilst it waits for the initial results of the National Highways' M4 to Dorset Connectivity study. There will be a further public consultation later this year.

<u>Budget</u> - At a marathon meeting on 15th February Wiltshire Council debated and agreed the 2022/23 budget and 10-year Business Plan. Over the next year the council will spend over £417m – with over 56% (£235m) on support and care for adults and children. Full Councilors' report is in the minutes on the PC website.

Minutes & Matters Arising—Minutes of meeting on 25th January were approved.

Items for Discussion from a Member of the Parish - A resident from The Stocks, spoke of his continuing concerns about speeding traffic at the Stocks/Seend Cleeve junction on the A361 and a number of near misses he has experienced here. He had spoken before to the Parish Council in July 2021 and at that time Councillors agreed to request a metro count with a view to getting the speed limit reduced from 50mph to 40mph. The metro count was undertaken in November 2021. Now that the results have proven that there is an issue with speeding, the resident has requested that the PC ask Highways for the speed limit to be reduced from 50mph to 30mph and for double white lines to be put in place to restrict overtaking by the Seend Cleeve junction.

Police Matters – Incidents:

Fri 28 Jan around 0900 – accident at top of Bell Hill at crossroads. Police attended.

Fri 28 Jan around 5pm – accident at Seend Head.

Wiltshire Police are urging dog owners to keep their pets under control after ewes have been killed in sheep-worrying attacks. As lambing season begins, police remind dog owners that livestock worrying is a criminal offence and farmers are legally entitled to shoot dogs if they are endangering or threatening their animals

Highway Meetings –

Metro Counts – The Stocks – this has taken place and the results prove that there is a speeding issue. Councillors agreed to submit a Highway Improvement Request to get the speed limit reduced from 50mph to 30mph. The High Street – this metro count should take place in March. CATG – the date of the next meeting is 12th April. The Chairman to attend. 3 Highway Improvement Requests will be submitted: Bell crossroads further small scale safety improvements (agreed at January PC meeting), horse warning signs at Redstocks, and a request to reduce the speed limit to 30mph at the Stocks and install double white lines to restrict overtaking close to this junction.

Neighbourhood Plan - Website - Mrs A'Bear reported that all the Neighbourhood Plan documents had been migrated on the Parish Council website. WALPA – Further meetings had taken place between the group and the Strategic Planning Team.

The aim being to develop additional practical proposals that can be put to government to address the current issues councils are facing with the undermining of their Neighbourhood Plans by planners and developers. Some local MPS were taking the plight of Neighbourhood planning to Westminster and some of the right questions were now being asked of government by them and Wiltshire Council. Mrs A'Bear said that Seend's membership of this group was a way of supporting its work, but that she was not taking an active part in the discussions. SPNPSG – Mrs A'Bear said that since the Neighbourhood Plan was made group members had dwindled, such that there is not really a committee at the moment. When a review of the Plan was needed in the future, there would be a need to recruit new members from the Parish.

<u>Resolution</u>: All Councillors in support of this application being approved. *NB: since this decision revised plans were submitted moving the parking from rear to front, so a revised PC comment was sent in objecting to the revision.*

<u>Application Ref: PL/2021/11736 - Woodpeckers, Berhills Lane, Seend SN12 6RR</u>

Proposal: Erection of two dwellings. <u>Resolution</u>: All Councillors in support of this application being approved.

<u>Application Ref: PL/2022/00869 - Mary Ann Cottage, 51 Seend Cleeve SN12 6PU</u>

Proposal: Erection of Single Storey Garden Room and Raised Deck Area to Rear Garden, Complete with Associated Works. <u>Resolution</u>: All Councillors in support of this application being approved.

<u>Parish Steward</u> – The Parish Steward from the Bradford Area had visited the Parish earlier this month and undertaken the jobs on the task sheet including the cleaning of the traffic bollards. It is hoped that we will have a new assigned parish steward in the coming weeks.

<u>Sandridge Solar Community Benefit Payment</u> – <u>CPR training</u> – Councillors agreed to ask Mr Mark Wood if he would be willing to undertake some more CPR awareness training sessions, the same as he has done in previous years.

<u>Bicycle Lock ups</u> - A parishioner had suggested that the Solar money be used to purchase bicycle racks to be installed by the Community Centre and the Pavilion. Councillors thought this an excellent idea. Mrs Akerman was asked to research costings and the Clerk was asked to write to the Community Centre and Lye Trustees to ask if they would approve a location. To report back at the next meeting.

Platinum Jubilee - Beacon Lighting - There will be a beacon lighting and a barbeque at the Community Centre on the evening of Thursday 2nd June. This is being organised by the Community Centre. Tree Planting – It was noted that there had been some discussions on the village facebook page about the Queen's Green Canopy Project, with some villagers expressing willingness to plant trees on their land. The Councillors discussed the difficulties they had had in 2018 in trying to secure land to plant 25 trees to commemorate the 25 soldiers who died in WW1, and were therefore reluctant to take a lead in a tree planting project in the Parish. Councillors suggested that the Parish Council could put a note in Spotlight and Facebook to find out what the likely interest would be from parishioners if the PC agreed to purchase a number of trees to give to individuals who The trees could be purchased from wanted to plant trees on their land. The Woodland Trust who is a partner of the Queen's Green Canopy Pro-Councillors agreed this course of action. ject.

<u>Clerk Vacancy</u> - The Chairman announced that following interviews, Mr Chris Stirland had been offered the position of Clerk and RFO. He will start on 7th March to begin the handover with the current clerk who will be stepping down at the end of April.

NATURE NOTES Summer Visitors

<u>House Martins</u>: These lovely migrant birds fly from Africa to nest in the British Isles, many in our area. They spend a long time making their mud nests under the eaves of houses. Please be tolerant of their building habits. The birds do not cause too much mess and they become distressed if all their hard work is destroyed. If house martins cannot raise their broods, yet another species will be endangered.

<u>Swallows</u>: These beautiful birds always return to their old nest sites, so please ensure access to them. If, for reasons of security, access has to be shut, swallows will fly through small openings in order to reach their traditional nesting sites.

<u>Swifts</u>: Their nesting sites, some of which are centuries old, are fast disappearing. They require an access tunnel of at least 18" long with a small entrance hole; please don't block them off. Swifts are believed to spend at much as nine months to a year on the wing, and they are known to nap whilst flying.

Swift sightings can be reported to Bradford-on-Avon Swift Group at <u>climate-champions@gmail.com</u>, or <u>www.swift-conservation.org</u>.

NOTE: These birds are, of course, protected species – it is an offence to disturb or destroy their nest sites and environments.

Cuckoos in Spring! Many people have remarked over the last decade that they haven't heard a cuckoo during springtime for ages. There does appear to be a decline of these migrants and the BTO (British Trust for Ornithology) is involved in research of this species. Cuckoos are still returning to the British Isles. Due to modern technology scientists are able to track tagged cuckoos from their wintering grounds in the Congo. Readers can follow the progress of returning cuckoos at www.bto.org/cuckoo. One, named Ellis, is making good progress on his way back to Perthshire. Anyone hearing or seeing a cuckoo can send their report to the BTO, RSPB, County Ornithological Society etc. (Don't be fooled by a neighbour's cuckoo clock!)

Bees Many are now on the wing again, especially some species of bumble

bees. All bees like to have a drink from a birdbath, shallow pond etc. They can also choose other containers such as watering cans or buckets of water etc. Unfortunately, many get trapped by these vessels and drown. Please try to remember to place a cover over the filler parts of these items. All bee species in the British Isles are in decline.
