

## **NEWS FROM SEEND PARISH COUNCIL**

### **Footpath Working Group** Seend Footpaths

The Parish Council is committed to keeping our footpaths and bridleways open and accessible as an important village amenity. However, we rely on our parishioners to report any problems such as broken stiles, blocked paths, overgrown vegetation etc. You can do this by contacting the Parish Council Footpath Officer (Jackie Hamblin) email: jackie.hamblin@seendparishcouncil.co.uk

Alternatively, you can report the problem to Wiltshire Council via their website or My Wiltshire app (https://my.wiltshire.gov.uk) with a copy to the Parish Council. If the issue is an overgrown path, then Seend Footpath Working Group can help and can usually sort it fairly quickly. More volunteers are always needed, so anyone interested in being notified when these working parties are happening, please contact Penny England 07855075780 or penny.england1380@btinternet.com.

#### Closure of School Grounds to Public Access

The Parish Council is trying to establish what views are held within the village regarding the continued closure of the School Grounds.

Whilst the Parish Council can understand the reason for closing the grounds to avoid the spread of Covid, it's not clear why this remains to be the case, particularly as government restrictions have been lifted.

There are significant reasons why the Parish Council would like to review the closure:

- It offers a safe route for pedestrians between the High Street/Dial Close and School Road avoiding the narrow section of the High Street. This section is notoriously bad for pedestrians with vehicles often mounting the pavement and frequent collisions between vehicles. This discourages people using the narrow footpath on this stretch of road.
- Although the school grounds are not formally recognised as a public footpath, it is legally a right of way which has been established over many decades.
- The school grounds are a great facility for younger children to play. The school grounds are specifically classified as a Community Facility within Seend Parish Neighbourhood Plan. We would like to hear the views of our Parishioners both for and against re-opening the school grounds so that we can gain a balanced view. # Maureen's Ramblings......

Wellsprings Benefice

Gosh – how I have missed travelling over the past few years! But what a lot of memories I have been able to draw upon - fed by 1000's of photos! (ADVERT – at 7.00 on 15th Sept. in Seend Pavilion, I am presenting another travel evening, this time about Chile, a wonderful country of contrasts. Please come along!) I loved Chile! A strong memory is of the seals and dolphins I saw in their natural habitat - basking in the sun, then in and out of the water, riding the surf and having such a good time, twisting, rolling and playing in the waves. I could almost see the smile on their faces! The native parrots in Brazil were also so colourful and playful - swooping low and noisily; enjoying the rush of wind over their wings as they braked suddenly to change course; chasing one another through the branches of the trees.

Does God play, I wonder? The One who created the playful flipper, the fun-filled swoop, must surely do what his creatures do. Maybe some animals were created out of God's playfulness: the oddly shaped platypus, the camel with its hump, the mischievous monkey and the long-necked giraffe. Yes, I think that God is playful! God does have a sense of humour! God likes fun!

But how often in history people have created God in their own image - sometimes as a dour and tyrannical fun-hater, eager for our obedience and conformity to exacting moral standards, hovering over us in judgement when we fail. How often the church has seemed dull and miserable, with lifted eyebrows should the sound of laughter or the sight of dancing break upon it. Have we missed something here? Perhaps the capacity to play and have fun is part of God's plan for us! Perhaps it is one of the ways in which we refresh and nourish our souls. Perhaps joy and laughter are fundamental to our faith in a creative, fun-loving God.

It was God who had the idea of the Sabbath rest – one day in the week put aside for time out from our busy, stressful lives; one day a week to be used for worship, rest and recreation, for refreshment and renewal. Sadly, this has rather been debased over the years - with every day looking like the next. But I think God got it right because we all need time to play and to laugh and to enjoy, and, like the seals and the parrots, take a break from the constant work of food gathering and nest building.

How much more creative and joyful our life and our relationships and our churches would be if there was more laughter and playfulness. And, as with Newton and his apple and Archimedes and his bath, some of the world's great discoveries have happened during a period of rest and playfulness. The seals and parrots remind me some important things. I need to give myself more space and permission to just have fun; to be creative and to laugh. And I need to rejoice more in the playful love of my Creator.

**Devizes Gateway:** Devizes Gateway (The proposed new Railway Station at Lydeway) has received additional funding to allow a further detailed study and proposed train timetable to be undertaken. This is expected to be completed within this financial year. The project will require civil works at Westbury to facilitate additional trains to support the new station

Local Cycling & Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWHIP): Devizes is included with the new action plan. However, Seend is outside the current plan and so will not benefit from the initial investment. There is a consultation website being set up. Cllr Reay to provide the address.

Electric Charging Points: Councillors noted that the existing funding arrangement from WCC excludes community facilities such as the Community Centre and Irene Usher Pavilion as they are on private land. Cllr Reay explained that the conditions of the funding arrangement is under review and she would lobby for an amendment. School Grounds Access: It was suggested that the Council should establish parishioners' views regarding the closure of the school grounds by placing an article in Spotlight. In addition, a direct approach should be made to the Friends of Seend School Governors' for their view.

# PCC PHILIP WILKINSON COLUMN

You will already be aware the police force watchdog HMICFRS has placed Wiltshire Police into 'special measures' as a result of its per-



formance. The Inspectorate's report is a sobering read and is highly disappointing, as I know it will be to our county's residents. It's especially disheartening because I know Wiltshire Police has many dedicated officers, staff and volunteers, working hard to deliver a quality, efficient, frontline service. But this report makes it clear there are areas of concern Wiltshire Police need to address: victims of crime, vulnerable people and our communities deserve better.

You had told me this in volume when I was on your doorstep and the results of my countywide survey and consultation only confirmed this, as well as from local councillors and MPs. I had already picked up on these points as part of my own strategic assessments of the Force and this shaped my Police and Crime Plan and influenced the robust and challenging scrutiny sessions I held with the Chief Constable from the outset. We now have a police and crime plan which ensures we meet and deliver those priorities influenced by you, focused on delivering a service the public want and prioritising those crimes that matter most to communities. My role as PCC is to scrutinise the policing service provided, to challenge where I see performance issues and then support the Chief Constable and Force to implement change. The necessary remedial measures needed to make the improvements highlighted in the report are already in progress and my immediate priority is to ensure that Wiltshire's Chief Constable, and his senior leadership team, move with focus and speed to dramatically improve performance, and quality and effectiveness of investigations. My aim, alongside the Chief Constable, is for Wiltshire Police to prioritise those crimes which matter most to communities so we can satisfy the Inspectorate but, more importantly, we can satisfy you as residents. Working together, the Chief Constable and I have already agreed on a back-to-basics reset for the Force, so I can assure you the process of change is already progressing. I expect to see a tangible change in service delivery and the Chief Constable has reassured me the necessary changes are in place. I will be receiving regular progress reports from him, to ensure those remedial actions are completed as soon as possible.

Thankfully, many residents do not need to use our policing service frequently but when they do the service they receive should be a quality frontline response. I will continue to ask for those assurances.

# **NATURE NOTES**

### **Nurture Nature**



Sir David Attenborough has said

lately that the world's insects are declining at an ever accelerating rate. So much of wildlife depends on insects, both for food, and fertilisation of plants. You can carry out a simple experiment, as we have been doing. On these steamy hot evenings, as it is getting dark, put a light on, open your door and watch what comes (flies) in. On two occasions out of three, not a single insect flew in at all – no moths no nocturnal small insects, no flies of any description. No wonder there have been no bats flying through our gardens lately with no insects to attract them, this once bounteous source of food – food for bats, birds, mammals, reptiles etc, is fast diminishing.

During May one expected May bugs (cockchafers) to barge noisily into the house and buzz haphazardly into light sources. We have not seen one for at least three years. There are fewer butterflies about his year, they should be bountiful in summertime. Why not join the current annual Big Butterfly Count, running from now until 7<sup>th</sup>August? Take part by visiting <u>bigbutterflycount.butterflyconservation.org/</u> or by downloading the free Big Butterfly Count app.

It has not been a good year for our breeding garden birds, mainly due to inclement weather earlier in the year. We only had one fledgling robin growing to maturity, usually there are at least six. However, maybe we shouldn't be over concerned about the lack of garden birds currently, as it is moulting time, and they will be skulking out of sight amongst the foliage until they have grown new feathers. But, they do like bathing frequently, so keep bird baths clean and topped up. Depending on the size of the baths, water may require changing four to five times a day!

Remember, too, that wasps, bees and other insects like to drink often, especially in hot weather, so please ensure full buckets, watering cans etc are kept covered so as to prevent insects from getting trapped and drowning. A sloping bird bath bowl is fine. Gardeners play a key role in biodiversity, and hedges, trees etc are essential for wildlife. They act as super highways for many creatures, birds, bats, hedgehogs, small mammals and reptiles – when did you last see a lizard in your garden, or anywhere else for that matter? They used to be so common.

Native trees and woodland are vital in our struggle against the loss of habitat and nature and changing climate patterns. We should all endeavour to protect threatened woods, restore ancient woodland, create havens for wildlife to help stop the devastating decline of our passerines, mammals, and other species. Together we can all make a difference. How have your children got on with E/As? Remember them? (Environmental Impact Assessments) of their gardens and local green spaces – are aims being achieved? After all, it is our children who will benefit by carrying the banner for conservation and regeneration of our woods, trees, wild life habitats etc.
