

CHURCH NEWS

The View from My Window: March 2022

Since I was a vicar in rural Oxfordshire I have always started my magazine articles with the title "The view from my window" and as I have moved to different places I have continued with this practice. This month is no exception although a very different view or two. I have been in hospital since Christmas, (and thank you to so many people who sent me good wishes and positive thoughts and prayers; they really did make a huge difference) but the view from my window in Guildford hospital was entirely different from any that had gone before. My ward was on the 5th floor and I could see 180 degrees of the Surrey hills and woods, to my extreme right I could see the cathedral, in the middle the incinerator chimney and to my left the path lab. What a stupid view to be writing about you may be thinking, but I had long enough to meditate upon it; the beauty of God's creation, the ingenuity and brilliance of man's innovations and the progress we have made in medicine. Now we all know one of the glories of living in the UK is the NHS and time and time again we have clapped for it, praised it and been so thankful, as indeed am I. But. There are things we need to know. In Guildford we had lots of lovely care assistants, who were efficient and neat and cheerful around the wards but communication was such a problem; elderly people with hearing aids and maskwearing carers are a difficult combination.

On being transferred to the prestigious heart hospital in Tooting, the same problems occurred. We all know that the NHS is under considerable strain at the moment; not many nurses, mainly care assistants, and the nurses there are having to spend most of their time on computers. (I did my own audit). Doctors sweeping in and out, delivering their prognoses and plans, and leaving patients dumbstruck not knowing what was about to happen; no time for the nurses to follow up with explanations. Procedure cancellations were frequent, not least my own, because elective patients had priority presumably because of numbers. I am not blaming the doctors for this. I repeat, we have all heard how much the NHS is under stress, but in the attempt to keep the ship afloat so to speak, it is the caring nature of the health profession that seems to be suffering mainly because of lack of time.

Why am I saying all this as part of a pastoral letter? The reason is this. We need to be honest. The church is often accused of being too bland or not courageous enough in speaking out and so I am trying to redress that a bit.

I know the National Health Service is one of the glories of the UK but we need to step up to the plate. Throwing money at it without a proper audit seems to be very unwise. In my view the NHS should not be about saving lives but healing people. (You may disagree.) All patients are people; people with hearts and minds and loved ones and relatives. The most important thing for us as human beings is that we are in relationship; relationship with living things; plants, animals and most particularly people., Communion and community are two words which are so close and so is communication. We need to take the time to communicate, particularly with the vulnerable. We are not machines. We are living, breathing sentient beings, who come from Almighty God our creator and whence one day we will all return. In my mind's eye I can picture Jesus the healer. Jesus who cared and suffered so much for human beings; Jesus who immediately knew that strength had gone out of him when someone touched him in faith; Jesus who spoke so clearly when he healed the sick. Jesus, who had time for each and every individual; Jesus the compassionate.

My prayer today is that we give thanks for all those people who are engaged in healing the sick whether in hospitals or GP practices, in social care or in our own communities, and that we pray for all carers whether professional or amateur. I pray that all of us take the time to listen, to be compassionate and to reach out to each other. It really matters.

Finance Planning: Following the increase of the Precept 2022/23 Councillors discussed future spending plans:

- Accessibility and pathway Councillors wish to make Bulkington more accessible for the elderly, parents with pushchairs and mobility scooters. This includes the village Recreation Ground. Wilshire Paving is coming to do a quote to aid initial planning and assist with requesting grants. Environmental and recycled options will be looked into and planning needs will be investigated.
- Electric car charging points or power sockets on site: with electric cars becoming more widespread councillors suggested plans for possible future

charging stations to support villagers. Electricity for Recreation Ground Events for things like generators, flood lighting etc. was discussed.

- Maintenance of existing Recreation Ground facility including the AstroTurf around the swing
- Grass cutting: Parish Councillors and the Rec Ground Committee have been looking for a more cost effective and reliable solution to managing the grass on the Recreation Ground
- Clerk to speak to Engagement Officer Andrew Jack to see if there are any volunteers through Wilshire Council that may be able to offer some expertise and help repair basic playground facilities.

Website: After many years of supporting the village by running the village website, Sue Barratt would like to hand over the maintenance of the website to someone else this year. We are looking for any volunteers to take on this role. The Parish Council would like to thank Sue for her managing the website so well. The website is not a Parish Council managed site – so Bulkington will be reliant on a villager to volunteer. The Parish Clerk will continue to update the Parish Council section of the website with current agendas and minutes. Clerk to ask Sue to add 2022 area on website

Recreation Ground: Any Playground updates

Following the payment for the Bonfire Night fireworks and new goal posts current finances are at £1790.44. The goal posts will be erected early spring, weather permitting.

SEEND PARISH COUNCIL November PC Meeting

<u>Attendance</u> – 8 Councillors: Apologies: Councillor Tamara Reay and Chairman Mr Terry James. Mrs Heatley was Acting Chairman.

<u>Minutes & Matters Arising</u> – Minutes of meeting on 30th November were approved.

<u>Gigaclear</u> – The Clerk said that they were continuing with their cable installation works, but she was only being given notice of where they were working in the Parish once the work had started. <u>**The Lye Green**</u> – The Clerk reported that Aster had written to all their tenants stating that no cars should be parked on the green but to use the designated parking bays. A note will also appear in the February issue of Spotlight. The Clerk said that there was still a post missing and a car was parked on the green by a property. An email response from Aster said: I have raised this job again as I visited a couple of weeks ago and noted the same, I have taken photos of some fresh areas that show missing posts and others where it would still be possible for motorists to drive through larger gaps. I am waiting to find out if the posts were replaced in December and if so and they have been removed again I will need to report this to Wiltshire Police for criminal damage.

Re-Dedication of the War Memorial – Mrs Heatley gave a report on the Rededication service for the 100th anniversary of the War Memorial. This took place on 2nd December at Seend Church with a short service in the church and by the War Memorial. The Duchess of Cornwall attended in her role as Patron of the War Memorials Trust. There were approx 100 guests. HRH was greeted on arrival by the Lord-Lieutenant Mrs Sarah Troughton who introduced the High Sheriff, Sir Charles Cobhouse Bt, Cllr Stuart Wheeler, Wilts Council Chairman, Cllr Anita Heatley, Vice Chair Seend PC, Asst Chief Constable Debs Smith and Maj (Retd) Robin Heatley, Chair Seend RBL who hosted the event. He introduced her to Revd Jane Knowles who conducted the service. 16 dignatories and parishioners were presented to the Duchess: General (Retd) Sir Jack Deverell KCB OBE (President Wiltshire RBL), Col (Retd) Nigel Knocker OBE (President Seend RBL), Mr Mike Swabey (Chairman Wiltshire RBL), Mr Paul Bunce (Wiltshire RBL), Mr Dave Beaumont (Seend RBL) Mrs Christine O'Reilly (Seend RBL), Mr Wayne Cherry (Seend RBL) and Mr Kevin Toft (Seend RBL and County Standard Bearer). Parishioners: Mrs Jackie Hamblin, Mr Geoff Newman and Mr Ray Lewis who had family named on the war memorial, Mrs Pauline Robertson (Nosh & Natter and WI), Mrs Sue Holloway (poppy collector), Mrs Rose Dick (Seend Playgroup), Mr Len Murray (Seend Churchwarden and Fawlty Players) and Mrs Sue Bond (Parish Clerk). HRH then signed the Church Visitor's Book. For the service outside, the Seend Singers led the National Anthem. The Duchess laid a bouquet of flowers,

the Lord-Lieutenant and Major Robin Heatley laid wreaths. The last post and two minute silence was observed. Afterwards, the Duchess spent some time admiring the new inscribed stone laid to mark the occasion, and talking to the bugler, the Seend Singers, Seend School and Playgroup children who were watching. Two children presented her with a posy before she left for Devizes. Len Murray has placed a copy of HRH signature from the Visitor's Book and a variety of photos on the wall of the vestry in the church. It was a splendid day, with lovely dry weather. There were a number of photographers in attendance, and photographic reports were seen in newspapers all over the UK.

Police Matters – Mrs Heatley said that there had been no report from our PCSO, but that she had got the details of two road accidents in the parish from the village Facebook.

13th Dec – about 3pm - accident at Bell Hill crossroads on A361.

21st Jan – about 4pm - accident on bend near Broad Lane on A365.

<u>Highway Meetings</u> – Mrs Heatley reported on two highway meetings that had taken place in January. On 7th January a site meeting at the Bell was held which included the Bell owner, Councillor Tamara Reay, Devizes Highways Engineer and three Councillors. (See full minutes).

A second Highways meeting was organized by Councillor Tamara Reay on 20th January. This took place on Teams and included: Councillor Reay, Senior Traffic Engineers for Devizes and Melksham, Devizes Highway Engineer, PC Councillors Anita Heatley and Georgina A'Bear and the Clerk. The PC raised concerns that despite the various road safety improvements carried out at the Bell cross roads in the last few years, accidents were still occurring with cars not stopping at the top of Bollands Hill and Bell Hill. The only accidents the Police report to Wiltshire Council are those that involve personal injury and therefore under-reports the actual number of accidents. The Clerk records all accidents in the Parish when she is made aware of them.

A number of improvements suggested by the Parish Council were deemed not feasible:

-Stop sign and continuous white line – the junctions don't meet the Department for Transport criteria.

-Speed bumps at the top of Bollands Hill would be too noisy and intrusive for neighbouring residents.

-Removing the current 30mph road sign at the top of Bell Hill would be too costly.

-The area is too small for a roundabout or roundel.

There were a number of suggested improvements, that it was agreed were worth looking further into, some small scale and some more substantial (See full minutes on PC website).

Asked where the Parish Council should go from here with this issue, the Devizes Senior Traffic Engineer said there were two levels of possible intervention: small scale measures that would cost in the region of £3-5,000 and more substantive measures which could cost many thousands. The Councillors agreed that they should submit an HIR to the next CATG meeting requesting further small scale measures as advised by Highways.

<u>Metro Counts</u> – The Clerk reported that the metro count in the High Street was due to be repeated in February as the previous count had been done at the wrong location. She had received the results of this count and the one carried out at The Stocks in November. To be discussed at the February meeting.

<u>Seend Parish Neighbourhood Plan</u> - SPNP website - Mrs A'Bear reported that Camelot Media had migrated all the NP documents from its own dedicated website on to the Parish Council one and that she would be cancelling the domain renewal for the seendparishplan.org

Both were approved by the sub-committee.

Parish Steward – The Clerk said that as far as she was aware we still did not have an assigned Parish Steward. Other Parish Stewards are supposed to be taking up the slack in our area, but don't think we had a visit in January. The Highways Engineer for Devizes has asked to be copied in when the Clerk sends in the monthly task sheet so he can keep an eye on what needs doing.

Sandridge Solar Community Benefit Payment – The Clerk said that £166 had already been spent on the purchase of 2 flags for Seend Church. There was still £1,000 left. A notice has gone into Spotlight asking for ideas on what to spend the money on. A resident of Seend Cleeve had asked if it were possible for the Parish Council to arrange for some CPR training for the village. Councillors thought that this was a good idea and asked the Clerk to get more details of costs, etc, but to wait to see what other suggestions come forward. To be further discussed at the next PC meeting.

Finance

Bank Reconciliation to end of Dec 2021 - £34,587.35

General Reserve – The Councillors had been circulated with a budget spreadsheet that showed the current balance and the likely balance at the end of the financial year once predicted expenditure was deducted. As there was likely to be a fairly high level of general reserve left, it was suggested that the Parish Council should give some financial support to the Lye Recreation Field Trustees to help purchase a new mower. Councillors agreed.

Date of next meetings – 22nd February, 29th March and 26th April.

UPDATE FROM THE POLICE AND CRIME COMMISSIONER

As your Police and Crime Commissioner, I appreciate that not everyone uses social media, so I have asked the many parish and village councils in the county if I can use your newsletters to let you know what is going on and what my office and the police are doing to keep you safe.

In my many meetings with our MPs, councillors and you, you have highlighted your concerns and set the priorities that I and the Chief Constable will deliver in my Police and Crime Plan. This plan, should it be endorsed in early March by the Police and Crime Panel, has been informed by you and what you have told me.

Your concerns relate to anti-social behaviour in all its guises; drug abuse and the violent crime that drug abuse drives; rural crime to include, fly-tipping poaching and hare coursing; speeding and road safety; on-line scams, child grooming and bullying; violence against women, girls, children and vulnerable people and burglary. Your most prevalent complaint was that the police response to your concerns and complaints was rarely effective or timely.

The focus of my plan will not only be on crime prosecution but also early engagement, prevention and education and, perhaps even more important, victim and witness support.

I have been working with the Chief Constable and we will deploy the additional 62 officers the government has awarded us to counter those threats that you have prioritised. Half of those additional officers will be deployed to counter those specific threats above and the remainder to boost your neighbourhood police teams in order to improve the response that you receive. More detail will follow with each of my briefs.

Here to Talk volunteers provide regular phone conversations to unpaid carers who feel they would benefit from having someone to chat with.

Anyone who is interested in this flexible volunteering role and can commit to the minimum of half an hour every two weeks is encouraged to get in touch, says Volunteer Recruitment Manager Amanda Rothwell. "Our telephone befriending service has helped to ease feelings of isolation for hundreds of unpaid carers. It's been more in demand since the pandemic began, but unpaid carers are often isolated even when there aren't any restrictions. When you are caring for someone

who is ill, or has a condition or disability, it can be difficult to leave the house. If you're the only person in your friendship group who is a carer, it can feel isolating."

Those who would like to volunteer and who meet the criteria will be provided by Carer Support Wiltshire with full training on subjects such as listening skills, confidentiality, safeguarding, mental health awareness and communication. Successful applicants will have a friendly approach with good listening skills, be non-judgemental with respect for different lifestyles and empathetic to the needs and concerns of unpaid carers.

THOMAS HELLIKER - INVITATION TO ANNUAL COMMEMORATION

The annual wreath laying organised by White Horse (Wiltshire) Trades Union Council to commemorate Thomas Helliker will take place on Tuesday 22nd March at noon at Thomas Helliker's Tomb in St James Churchyard, Trowbridge. BA14 8DU.

Thomas Helliker, often referred to as the Trowbridge Martyr, was a young apprentice shearman working in the woollen industry. When Littleton Mill, near Seend was burned down in protest at the introduction of machinery he was apprehended on false accusation despite having an alibi and protesting his innocence. Although he probably knew those who had set the fire, he steadfastly refused to name them. He was charged and sent for trial in Salisbury, where he was subsequently found guilty and was hanged at Fisherton Goal on his 19th birthday on 22nd March 1803 despite public outrage. It is likely that he had been framed by powerful clothiers determined to make an example. We do hope you will be able to join us.
