REMEMBRANCE – A PERSONAL REFLECTION

To mark the 65th anniversary of the end of WWII the Heritage Lottery Fund again sponsored the Veterans' Return Scheme. This enabled veterans, spouses and, if necessary, carers, to visit the areas where they had fought and to honour, through visits to War Graves Commission Cemeteries, comrades who had been killed during the fighting.

My wife and I were awarded a grant and went in mid-September to Ravenna in Italy. We visited Forli Cemetery and found the graves of Gunners Archer and Howlett. They had been killed when their vehicle, the water wagon, received a direct hit when our convoy was moving into new gun positions.

With information from the War Graves Commission website we had no difficulty in finding the graces and placing remembrance crosses on them. We read the campaign history in the entrance porch and I signed the visitors' book, adding my tribute to these two well remembered friends.

Bert Archer had a good baritone voice and sang Edwardian ballads, often "Trumpeter, what are you sounding now?". Basil Howlett was a cheerful man and brought the daily ration of water with the same good humour with which he had delivered bread at home. The date of death on the gravestones was 17th December 1944, which was a nightmare of a day that I well remember. As we approached the farm which was to be the battery HQ, George Torrance stepped out on to a schu mine, losing a foot. When we eventually got to the farmhouse we found the farmer lying at the door with both legs missing, another Italian with one leg missing and the women weeping at the horror. The Germans had defended the farm and schu mines had been laid liberally. Later Gunner Pyle lost both feet and there were more civilian casualties.

Harry Seccombe often said "Old soldiers remember because they can't forget". Our visit to Forli Cemetery made me thankful again that I came home in one piece, but deeply saddened at so many lives cut short and so many families bereft of loved ones.

CHURCH AND CHAPEL NEWS

Letter from the Vicarage

The results of the Village Appraisal are currently being analysed in depth, but at first sight we are encouraged by the results so far as your village church is concerned and we are most grateful to all those who responded. Certainly we will be addressing those areas where it was felt we could do better! It's not possible to cover all the issues raised in the space available here so we will try to answer the points you raised over as short a period as possible.

One common theme was how little some of you know about the day to day workings of the church. Ah! Communication is always the weak point isn't it! I'm not really sure whether these comments related to the routine – ie the pattern of services and so forth, or all the actual administration that goes into making a village church function. But today I will concentrate on the former point.

I expect you realise that we have a fairly regular pattern of services on Sundays -8am (said –no singing or music) Holy Communion every week. Then, at Seend the main morning service is at 11.15 am. The first Sunday of the month is an informal service, suitable for people of all ages, with no Communion, the second and third Sundays are Parish Communion, and Family Communion follows every fourth Sunday. On fifth Sundays (usually four a year) the service is held at 10.00 am. These are held jointly with the congregations of Seend, Bulkington and Poulshot churches, and the Wesley Chapel in Seend and we take it in turns to hold these services in each other's place of worship. They're usually followed by light refreshments.

Occasionally changes have to be made to accommodate "specials" – the Remembrance Sunday services at each of our churches being a very good example. As we approach the Christmas season there will be several extra things to look forward to – for example the school's Christingle service on 8th December, the Carol services, and the crib services. This year Seend's "Scratch Nativity" will take place in the Vicarage Garden as usual (and everyone is invited!) – again there will be a live donkey – and there will be hot drinks and mince pies for everyone (remember the cold snow last year?!!!) – so do start looking out all those fancy dress costumes for our shepherds and angels and kings again.

I am delighted that we are forging ever closer links with our village school and we welcome every opportunity to strengthen them by involving our children with church activities whenever possible. The children will be taking part in our Remembrance services, as well as at Christmas and we will be starting an "Open the Book" project in the New Year, when a team will be going into the school to act out Bible stories. This has proved to be really popular countrywide and the children can often be drawn in to be part of the action.

Please take time to read about some of the other church activities that are currently in progress, or planned, as well as the notices of the current month's services published in this magazine, and displayed on the board outside the Vicarage, and the church porch. SEEND COMMUNITY CENTRE NEWS

SEEND LYEFIELD AND PAVILION

As Chairman of the Lye field Recreational Committee, I feel it is opportune to give the community a brief history of the Lye Field after almost 45 years as a vital amenity of Seend. The recent Village Assessment revealed a large minority of respondents to the questionnaire who knew nothing of the work of the committee and the management of its day-to-day affairs. Having lived in the village for 35 years, I feel I can speak with some authority about the people who did some truly amazing things to create the Lye Field and the Pavilion for the benefit and enjoyment of all the people living in and around Seend. The need for a recreational area in the village was first mooted in the mid-sixties by the older members of the community when they became concerned by the lack of amenities for the youngsters of the village.

The idea of a community led initiative to provide the village with a sports field, especially for the young people of the village, was further strengthened by the threat, in 1967 by the owners of the field, to sell it for a housing development. This was as contentious then as it would be now. There was a great deal of soul searching and attempts to improve the recreational facilities in the village by those concerned about the future of the community's children and decisive action was started by a small number of senior members of the community with the time and resources to make things happen.

Money was the limiting factor in the purchase of the Lyefield and to facilitate the efficient raising of the cash, an application was submitted to the Charities Commission and the Lyefield was successfully granted charitable status. A bank loan was arranged, underwritten by Mr Archie Kidd and Miss Irene Usher, with many money raising schemes introduced including traction engine rallies, which brought in most of the cash, but it was the entire village's will to succeed that really came together to make the whole project viable. Their efforts cannot be underestimated or praised enough by us all who use the Pavilion today.

Upkeep of the Lye Field is very reliant on money raised by hiring the hall and field, donations, the annual Seend Fete and the 100 club. The Lye Field Committee is made up of representatives of most of the village organisations who vote for various day-today expenditures. The committee meets four times a year with an executive committee meeting more regularly if required. However, if any major costs are to be incurred, consultation with the full committee is practiced before the money is spent. Five trustees of the Lye Field are responsible for the prudent overseeing of the charity.

The Lye Field has built up financial reserves over many years by careful management of the funds, which are essential for contributing to a positive cash flow to meet the ever-increasing costs of running the charity. However, the income generated from these funds is not sufficient to meet the total costs incurred by the maintenance of the building and field. This is why the income generated by the Seend Fete is so important to keep the Lye Field in its present excellent condition now and in the future.

Committee members all make a great contribution to the success of the Fete and have done so for many years, especially the Fete Committee, which this year did an outstanding job of organising and running the event, which proved to be a great success.

Villagers, who know little of the workings of the committee, should be aware of those unpaid volunteers, who give their time and expertise freely purely to ensure the facility is clean, well maintained and safe for all users, including the maintenance and running of the Pavilion. Anyone with the time and inclination to help the existing team will be most welcome, as most of us are not getting any younger! Finally, I encourage all the people who need a venue for parties, meetings or for any activity, which requires such a facility, to consider using the Pavilion and Lye Field. The rates for hiring the pavilion are very competitive, and you would be making a useful and worthwhile contribution to a priceless community asset.

At October's meeting Bob and Mary Biggs came to talk about herbs, bringing with them a huge quantity of plants to talk about and pass round. Here are some of Bob's thoughts..



Of all the many different mints Moroccan mint is the one to use for mint tea, grapefruit mint for fruit recipes and English lamb mint for the Sunday roast. Garlic chives can be used instead of garlic to give the taste without the effects and the flowers of both kinds of chive can be eaten in salads too. Lovage makes a good substitute for celery flavouring but grows very tall. Sweet Cicely can be used to sweeten dishes instead of sugar and salad burnett has a cucumber flavour without the same effect. To harvest parsley, chives and other herbs you should cut the whole stem in order to encourage new growth. The competition was won by Jeni Raby-Cox. As usual the same 3 people entered and they would like some competition from the rest of us. On 8th November the competition is a photo of a garden enemy and I am expecting some interesting pictures. SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

The meeting held on **Tuesday 27th September** was attended by 9 Councillors with Mr. J. Padfield in the chair in the absence of the Vice-Chairman; also in attendance were Cllr. J. Seed and Belinda Fowler from Community First and 2 members of the public. Apologies received from Mrs. T. Carr and Mrs L. Waylen.

Prior to the start of the public meeting, Belinda Fowler from Community First gave an outline of Parish Plans. She said that the underlying principle of Community First is strengthening communities, and part of this is to support parishes undertaking a Parish Plan. She said that the plan should be thought of as a parish strategy; it should involve the whole community and reflect what they value about their community, it should also contain an action plan. A Parish Plan can provide evidence on issues and can feed into development plans. It can cover issues that affect communities such as development, traffic, the environment or older people.

Election of Councillor, due to the resignation of Anita Heatley

Mr Michael Johnson of 20 Dial Close had been elected unopposed. Mr. Johnson attended the meeting from 8.00 p.m., and signed the Declaration of Acceptance.

Matters arising

War Memorial – Confirmation has been received from the Area Board of a grant of £288 towards the refurbishment of the War Memorial. It was unanimously agreed that the remedial work should now go ahead, accepting the quote of James Long (Masons) Ltd.

Allotments – Three quotes have now been received for the work to the new entrance for the allotments. The Clerk undertook a site visit with the Probation Service who have agreed to clear a further area of the allotments, using Community Payback, over 4 Saturdays in October and November, commencing 8 October.

Members agreed unanimously to accept the quote from PJ Dyke for the work to the allotment entrance.

Love Walk, replacement of stone steps - Further quotes received, also awaiting a quote from Seb Abbott, a Wiltshire Council approved supplier. It was suggested to ask P J Dyke for a quote as well. It was still not clear whether Wiltshire Council intended to pay for the work to be undertaken, or whether the landowner was liable for some of the cost. Cllr. Seed said that he would follow this matter up with Wiltshire Council on behalf of the PC.

Highway Matters - Mrs. Waylen had advised that the best location for the new grit bin is just inside the entrance to The Lye on the left-hand-side. It was agreed to purchase a bin in readiness for the winter.

Old Railway Bridge, Station Road - The remedial works have now been completed.

Barbara Booth, trees in memory – A quote for trees in the sum of approx. $\pounds 275$ had been received, further quotes awaited. It was suggested that a small plaque be obtained for the lilac tree in Seend Cleeve.

Rusty Lane - Nick Keen has indicated that he has no objections in principle to a finger post on his land at the bottom of Rusty Lane, but requests a site visit with a member of the PC; Mr. Padfield agreed to undertake the site visit. The Clerk has contacted Melksham Without PC re. the finger post signs in Bowerhill. These were supplied by their ROW Officer, Paul Millard. The Clerk to follow this up and get more details.

Footpath SEEN4, Three Magpies - The Caravan & Camping Club site advise that they have notices on site about dog walkers picking up after their dogs, and also provide bins on site for waste. An e-mail has been sent to Wiltshire Council to request a bin to be installed by the kissing gate. They have responded that, due to budget restrictions, they can't purchase a new bin. However, if the PC or caravan site would like to sponsor a bin, they will install the bin and empty fortnightly. Cllr. Seed offered to make contact with Wadworths to see if they would sponsor a bin. The Clerk to obtain prices. *School Road* – Mike Cooper at the Environment Agency, Chippenham will take up the matter of washing out of a concrete delivery lorry with Wiltshire Concrete. Highways have been advised in case there is any problem in the future from the concrete residue washed down the drain.

Village Appraisal

Mr. Murch said that some forms are still trickling in. The spreadsheet required to be corrected, and this had held up processing somewhat. He hoped that the results would be available for the October PC meeting. He has provisionally booked the Irene Usher Pavilion for Tuesday 21 November, 7.30 p.m. for the village meeting. He would invite the other organisations to present their findings. Mr. Diffey said that it would be necessary to see the outcome of the Appraisal before we go to a Parish Plan, and we need to publicise the outcomes.
