

RNLI – House to house and Devizes Flag Day Collection: April 2013

What a superb result!! Thank you everyone from Seend, Seend Cleeve, Martinslade and Bulkington for giving your time and effort to collect for the Life Boats. Here are the results. The figures in brackets show last years totals. Percentages are rounded to the nearest whole number.

In the village, we collected £530.88 (£553.05) -4% lower than last year but, considering one of our regular collectors was unavailable, this was a good result. The total house-to-house amount for all areas was £5055.39 (£4564.71) - 11% up on last year. The Flag Day in Devizes raised £968.58 (£923.53) - up on last year by 5%. The overall total (Flag Day and villages) was £6023.97 (£5488.24) - 10% up on last year.

This is a fantastic achievement. We have never before broken £6000 and when we consider the economic situation and the general reduction in contributions to many charities, this is an excellent result. Thank you once again, everyone, for another outstanding effort for a worthy cause supported wholly by charitable contributions.

Maureen's Ramblings......

One of the joys of visiting South America recently was to see seals and dolphins in their natural habitat. One special moment was watching seals at Coquimbo in Chile. Some seals were basking in the sun on the beach, but others were in and out of the water, riding in the surf. They were having such a good time! They twisted and rolled, lifted their faces out of the water and seemed to give wriggles of enjoyment. They were playing, gambolling in the wash of the sea as it hit the beach. I could almost see the smile on their faces! The native parrots in Brazil were also so colourful and playful, swooping across the landscape in the early evening, enjoying the rush of wind over their wings as they braked suddenly to change course, chasing one another through the branches of the trees. Does God play, I wondered? The One who created the playful flipper, the fun-filled swoop, must surely be more than able to do what his creatures do. I wondered if some animals were created out of God's playfulness: the oddly shaped platypus, the camel with its hump, the mischievous monkey and the long necked giraffe. Yes – I think that God is playful! God does have a sense of humour! God likes fun!

But how often in history the church has created God in its own image, sometimes as a dour and tyrannical fun hater, eager for our obedience and conformity to exacting moral standards, hovering over us in judgement when we fail. How often the church has seemed dull and miserable, with lifted eyebrows should the sound of laughter or the sight of dancing break upon it. Have we missed something here? Perhaps the capacity to play and have fun is part of God's plan for us. Perhaps it is one of the ways in which we refresh and nourish our souls. Perhaps joy and laughter are fundamental to our faith in a creative, fun loving God. Voltaire once wrote that God was a comedian, playing to an audience that was too afraid to laugh! How hard that must be for God!

It was God who had the idea of the Sabbath rest – one day in the week put aside for rest and recreation, refreshment and renewal. Sadly this has rather been debased over recent years, with every day looking like the next, but I think God got it right because we all need regular time out from the busyness and stresses of our daily lives, from the worries and concerns. We need time to play and to laugh and to enjoy, and, like the seals and the parrots, we need a break from the constant work of food gathering and nest building.

How much more creative and joyful our life, and our church life, and our relationships would be if there was more laughter and playfulness. And lots of people testify to something creative happening during play. The writer speaks of *playing* with ideas; the musician *plays* with variations to a tune. As with Newton and his apple and Archimedes and his bath, some of the world's great discoveries have happened during a period of rest and playfulness. The seals and the parrots have taught me some important things. I need to give myself space to just have fun. I need to bring more creativity into my times of recreation. I need to laugh more. And I need to rejoice in the playful love of my Creator.

New Features of Section D, 'Home Produce': Specified recipes are issued for the Victoria Sponge and Date & Walnut Loaf classes (see the Schedule Guidance Notes); 'Fruit Scones' reintroduced; 'Bread Granary' added to the bread classes; 'Liqueur Homemade' added to the alcohols.

Children's Sections F and G replace the single children's section of previous years. We hope that parents will encourage their children to participate in as many classes as possible. There is no fee for entries in these sections.

Section G is for 9 to 12 year olds. The new classes of 'Monster from Scrap' and 'Design a Flower Show Poster' should inspire some creativity as should 'Cupcakes'. The 'Computer Art' classes in both of the Sections offer creativity of a different kind.

SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

N.B. These notes are from the draft minutes of Parish Council meetings, and may not yet have been ratified.

The meeting held on **Tuesday 30th April** was attended by eight Councillors with Mr. J. Padfield in the chair. Apologies received from Mr M Johnson, Mr T Murch and Mrs L Waylen.

The Chairman welcomed back CBM PC Emily Thomas following her maternity leave. She reported that a car had been taken from Rusty Lane on 6 April; a car had been damaged in Seend Cleeve; a garden shed had been broken into at Weavers Cottages, although nothing was taken.

Cllr Seed reported that work had now started on removal of the railway bridge, and the work should take about eight weeks; there had been a meeting with landowners the previous day. A Councillor asked about the work being undertaken at 19 Seend Cleeve, as a parishioner had queried whether the green notice had been displayed; Cllr Seed assured the PC that it had been displayed. A Councillor pointed out that the bridleway sign at the top of Rusty Lane by the Community Centre was missing.

Exiting from Weavers Cottages – A meeting took place on 28th March with Highways and a representative from Wadworths. Highways indicated they would not approve the use of mirrors, but did suggest the use of bollards on the pavement at the end of Weavers Cottages. The PC discussed this option, and was not in favour of the installation of bollards.

Metro count, High Street - The metro count at the western end of the High Street is specifically counting HGVs. This is being done in conjunction with Highways starting to get in touch with hauliers that use the A361 through Seend providing them with information on using Wiltshire's advisory freight route network, specifically the A365, and planning their journeys via the Wiltshire Freight Gateway. Highways will also shortly be looking into the issue of reviewing the road signage as well, so that hauliers are encouraged to use the A365 rather than the route through Seend. The Parish Council have been requested to send Laura Gosling the details of any hauliers that they know regularly use the route. The hauliers' name should be sufficient as they should be able to obtain their contact details via the VOSA website.

19 Seend Cleeve – The planning application has now been submitted.

Planning – Little Foxes – nothing further at present. Next Planning Committee meeting scheduled for 30th May.

Dial Close, change of use – An email had been sent to Steven Jenkins. He replied that unless the property was used solely for business, there was no need for a change of use application.

Village Promotion

A fourth £50 cheque has been received from the Lye Field Committee, and a plaque ordered.

It was noted that the bus shelter in Sells Green was now complete, and looked very nice. The Clerk to write to Mr Johnstone and thank him. The question of a notice board was discussed, and it was agreed to look at purchasing a new board to go inside the new bus shelter. The Clerk to obtain quotes.

Planning Matters

E/2013/0343/TCA The Hatch, High Street Fell two Betula Pubscens Trees

Councillors discussed this application and voted in 7 in favour, 1 against. Comments the trees to be replaced.

E/2013/0372/S73 Little Thornham Farm Bungalow, Trowbridge Road Removal of condition 2 of planning permission B4922/P372 – to remove the Agricultural occupancy condition.

Councillors discussed this application and voted unanimously in favour.

E/2013/00065/FUL 19 Seend Cleeve

Proposed single storey rear extension and installation of dormer window to first floor roof; rebuilding of detached garage.

Councillors discussed this application and voted unanimously in favour.

E/2013/00106/FUL Lock Cottage, Bollands Hill

Formation of a permanent mooring on the towpath side of the K & A Canal near Lock Cottage to provide extra accommodation in the form of canal boat for self catering tourists.

Councillors discussed this application, and voted 7 against, 1 abstention.

Comments: lack of car parking and danger crossing the road from the lay-by; not wishing to set a precedent for granting of permanent moorings; additional pedestrians using the road; inadequate septic tank; the safety aspect of using a rowing boat to travel between Lock Cottage and the canal boat.

Seats around the village – these will receive preservative as soon as the weather allows.

Footpath The Bell to The Stocks – this needs re-treating with weedkiller.

Potholes – Inmarsh – There are two potholes just down from Broomhayes, and outside Inmarsh Farm. The Parish Steward to be advised.

Manhole, Bollands Hill – This needed to be inspected. The Clerk to advise Highways.

Old Wyatts, Row Lane – Complaints received about water draining through the wall and running across the road. The sets need lowering so that water runs into the drain on the Old Wyatts side of the lane at the end of the footpath.

WI Hall - guttering appears to be missing, the Clerk to ask the WI about their maintenance programme.

The date of the next meeting is **Tuesday**, **28**th **May 2013** at 7.15pm in the Community Centre, to view planning applications, with the public meeting commencing at 7.30pm.


I know that there has been little else spoken of in the Village Shop of late but for those of you who missed it I can report that the lads, and of course the lasses, have brought home the bacon in the form of the

A RESPONSE TO THE LETTER IN LAST MONTH'S SPOTLIGHT

It is unfortunate that the recent article in the May edition of Spotlight included some misleading statements. Our understanding of Spotlight's purpose is that it should convey information about village activities. If Spotlight is going to become a vehicle for parishioners to air particular grievances, then it may be embarking on a very problematic course.

It is not accurate to say that there is only one nine year-old playing on a scooter. There are often three or more children, some of whom are over eleven, playing in the middle of the road, in one specific area of Dial Close. The children, who are invariably polite, do not always respect the boundaries of planted gardens and private driveways, when involved in their activities. There are other children who ride on their scooters on the pavements and do not give any cause for concern and safety.

The section of road has become similar to a skateboard park with the clattering of scooters as they launch off the pavements and off a mobile ramp. The ramp is positioned in the middle of the road and has to be hastily removed when traffic approaches. Residents of Dial Close drive with care but there are commercial deliveries and the drivers would not anticipate that children and obstacles are in the middle of the road. There have been a number of occasions when the ramp has been left in the middle of the road and the children have gone elsewhere.

Residents are concerned about the safety of the children and all users of the road. None of the residents want to see an unfortunate accident neither do they want to curtail children playing, providing it is in a safe environment. Residents also want children to respect their property and not to experience an unreasonable level of noise and disturbance on a regular basis, outside of their homes.

There is a paucity of play provision and activities for children over the age of eight, in this community. The Parish Appraisal identified this as a concern. A solution may be that village organisations, working with the Parish Council, should address this lack of provision and investigate what children in this age group would like to see provided. As an example, a number of our neighbouring villages have created scooter and skateboard designated areas. If we had one in Seend this would provide a play area for future generations.

N.B. Both last month's letter and this one have been published anonymously, but the editors have decided that any future correspondence on this or other village issues should bear the contributor's name.

In Wiltshire:

- · Grey partridge have declined by 69% since 1995.
- · Curlew have declined by 41% since 1995.
- Our iconic Lapwing are in decline on Wiltshire's farmland
- Sites where the nationally scarce snakes head fritillary is found has declined from eleven to just six, with the Trust's Clattinger Farm being one of the most important.
- The beautiful green-winged orchid which has declined dramatically at a national level can also be found in their thousands at Clattinger Farm.
- · Both pearl-bordered and small pearl-bordered fritillary have declined seriously across Wiltshire's woodland. They are now confined to a few woodland in the south of the county.
- · The willow tit is declining seriously in our wet woodland.
- · In our rivers, the white clawed crayfish are not coping well, being outcompeted by the invasive signal crayfish from the United States.

"We are at a critical turning point in the future of Wiltshire's wildlife. Decisions we make now will impact on the wildlife and health of the countryside we leave for future generations. Wiltshire is a remarkably beautiful county and we want it to remain so in the future. We must all work together to ensure that we balance the demands of food production, development and wildlife so that we can enjoy the benefits that each brings. We need a new vision for our communities, where people live alongside and are able to engage directly with the natural world. This is essential for our future health and well-being."

"There are steps that each of us can take," Dr Mantle explained. "Build a garden pond, plant bee-friendly wildflowers, grow your own food, join a local conservation group, join Wiltshire Wildlife Trust, and help us to record species by reporting sightings to the Wiltshire and Swindon Biological Records Centre."
