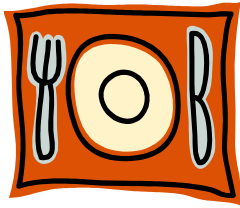

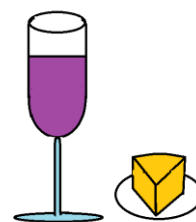

SEEND FETE 2016

The Seend Lye Recreation Field is a charitable trust set up to administer and manage the Seend Lye Field, the Irene Usher Memorial Pavilion and tennis courts. The trust is run by volunteer trustees and committee members. Committee members are elected from the organisations using the 'Lye Field' facilities. The trust's assets are held for the parishioners of the Parish of Seend.

The running costs for the Lye Field facilities are in excess of £10,000 per annum and costs are met approximately equally from the following primary sources, investment income, facilities hire/100+ Club and the annual Seend Fete. The combined annual income provides great facilities for many small interest groups and permits organisations, such as the Seend Playgroup, Seend WI, Seend Brownies and many others to operate at minimal group costs.

Readers will have noted the many recent pleas from Jo McManus, outgoing Chair of the Seend Fete Committee, for help in ensuring the Seend Fete runs in 2016 and

beyond. Seend is no different to many English villages, struggling with an ageing population, to keep village organisations and traditions alive for the future, making it the great place to live that it is. We have much competing for our time and attention but many of us can recall the names of the valiant many, going back into antiquity, who have freely given time and support to the social enterprises of the parish, including the Seend Fete, which has certainly earned the reputation of being the best fete for many miles around, making it a great community event.

The Lye Field trustees feel that this has to be the final appeal for people to come forward and be counted as friends of the excellent parish facilities we perhaps take for granted – simply because they have always been there and available.

The Seend Fete has always succeeded because of the wonderfully imaginative and dedicated efforts of small groups of friends working together as teams for the common good. A few fete stalls raise significant amounts of money, some lose money or break even, but they are all fun on the day and overall they cover over 30% of Lye Field running costs in one great summer afternoon. If you are not prepared to let that go quietly then contact the Lye Field trustees now. The equipment, facilities, financial support, all the “how to?” information remains in place for the fete to continue at any scale. The small teams who turn up time and time again to run the Bottle Stall, Tombola, Grand Draw, Book Stall, Bric-a-Brac and many others are all still there. They just need someone with organisation and direction skills to step up now and lead the way. If you feel you want to do this you will be supported. If you feel you have another idea that you would like to run with let’s hear it. The Lye Field trustees feel that if the fete fails to continue in 2016 it will be lost for ever.

ONE WAY SYSTEM IN SEEND CLEEVE

For the duration of the work at the canal bridge by The Barge in Seend Cleeve, there is a one-way system in operation through Seend Cleeve, and exiting the village via Pelch Lane.

Pelch Lane is ONE WAY ONLY from Pelch Barn, 56A Seend Cleeve, SN12 6PZ to the top of Pelch Lane where it exits onto Bollands Hill, and it is NO ENTRY from Bollands Hill. If you spot any vehicle entering Pelch Lane from Bollands Hill, and can identify the company or driver, please contact me ((Rosemary Fisher, Clerk to the Parish Council on 01380 828281) with registration number if possible, and I will report it to the company concerned, and the Police.

NEWS about the SEEND PARISH NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Soon after receiving this Newsletter, you will find the **Rural Housing Needs Survey** is dropped through your letter- box. It is very important to us that you do not think it is just another circular, and bin it by mistake! You will also see a number of A5 notices around the village, alerting you to its arrival and emphasising the importance of filling it in and returning it in the pre-paid envelope within 3 weeks of its arrival, which makes April 11th the closing date.

Why do we need your co-operation over this? Your responses will be influential in forming the basis of any future plan as to what housing, if any, will be required within our Parish. Only if we get a good return will the result be termed ‘robust’ in research terminology, and therefore become part of a reliable evidence base from which we can argue for what we, as a Parish want. If we do not get a good return, it could mean that much of our work is wasted, so please be sure to play your part in creating the Neighbourhood Plan.

A further comprehensive survey, which the Steering Group is developing, will follow later in the year to cover other aspects of our village life.

Our **Traffic Sub-Group** is collecting data about any accident or traffic incident within the Parish and would like to hear from you if you have anything to report. Nigel Knott may be contacted directly at nigel@onbite.com with any relevant information.

CHURCH AND CHAPEL NEWS

Maureen's Easter ramblings.....

On Easter Day I have the privilege and joy of proclaiming again “**Christ is risen! Alleluia! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!**” I love it! I love Easter! The blessing of Easter has changed my life – giving me hope, purpose and meaning, especially as I reflect on the suffering and woundedness of the world. *“Tomb, you shall not hold him longer, death is strong, but life is stronger; stronger than the dark, the light; stronger than the wrong, the right; faith and hope triumphant say; Christ will rise on Easter Day”.*

A Sunday school teacher was teaching her class about the Passion of Jesus-his sufferings, death and burial and about how the women went to the tomb early in the morning and found that the tomb was empty. Then she asked, “**what do you think were the first words that Jesus said when he came out from the tomb, risen from the dead?**” Lots of hands shot up. “**Yes?**” She said, pointing to a child on the second row. The boy stood up excitedly – “**Ta da!**”

Easter Day is a **Ta-da day!** For me it is the most wonderful day of the year as I reflect that God walked our earth, sharing in the pain and suffering of a humanity that had lost their way, sharing in my pain. In his words and actions Jesus taught us all we

needed to know about love and hope and eternity. He looked into the face of evil that will always try and destroy love— and defeated it. Yes! Evil can be defeated! He faced the biggest fear of humanity – death – and moved beyond it into eternity. Yes! We can move beyond death into eternity! He rose again to be with us always. Therefore I am never alone. And still, with arms of love open to us – he invites us “come to me”. **Christ is risen! Alleluia! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!**

The joy and excitement of Easter Day is like that of a premier division crowd as their football team scores the winning goal just 30 seconds from the final whistle. The resurrection is GOOD NEWS. Good news for those first disciples; good news for us and good news for the world. St Augustine of Hippo said that “*A Christian is an alleluia from head to foot*”. But, sadly, most people in our increasingly secular world miss it and Easter Day will be just another day (except for the chocolate and Easter bunnies!)

“O Lord, you love us! Why aren’t we shouting? The stone’s rolled away! Why aren’t we dancing?

O Lord, you love us! Why aren’t the bells pealing? The victory’s won! Why aren’t the drums drumming? Why aren’t the feet stamping and the doves flying and the bands marching and the fingers snapping and the tongues praising and the hands clapping and the trumpets blaring and the choirs singing and the cymbals clashing and the children laughing? Why aren’t the eyes smiling and the banners blowing and the horns sounding and the voices calling and the crowds clamouring and the arms waving and the tambourines playing and the hearts humming.....”.

Our Easter services are at 8.00am and 11.00am at Seend and 9.15am at Bulkington and Poulshot.

May God bless you and surprise you with his love and joy this Easter.

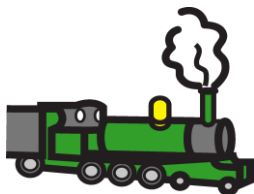

GREAT BULKINGTON RAILWAY – OPEN DAY

The sit-on-and-Ride Great Bulkington Railway will be offering rides on Easter Monday, March 28th from 1300 to 1630 hours to the general public.

Rides cost a pound (twice around) – in aid of Wiltshire Air Ambulance. We have around a thousand feet of 5 inch gauge track, a forty foot long tunnel and a signalling system. We are located next to Bulkington Village Hall, near Seend at SN10 1SW. We expect that the good ladies from Christ Church in our village will be serving teas and cakes in the Village Hall. ALSO On Saturday 19th of March we will also be running the railway in the afternoon in support of the Jumble sale organised by Annica Bowen in the village hall – bring along your ‘Teddy Bear’ and have one free ride!

WANTED

I am in need of recruiting a trainee signal person (M or F) to assist the Station Master in the operation of the Great Bulkington Railway six or seven times a year when we have public running and children’s birthday parties mostly on Saturdays and Sunday afternoons.

No particular technical knowledge or age is required – but lots of common sense and a calm disposition. The signal system is fully automatic with safety devices. It does however allow the signalman to over-ride it whenever the Station Master needs to do so – perhaps during busy times. Full one to one training will be offered and this will also include some engine driving instruction.

SEEND PARISH COUNCIL

N.B. These notes are from the draft minutes of Parish Council meetings, and may not yet have been ratified.

The meeting held on **Tuesday 26th January 2016** was attended by 9 Councillors with Mr J Padfield in the chair. Apologies received from Mr T Murch and Mr K Rigg; also present members of the public

Police and Local Councillor's Matters

Cllr Seed reported that the railings outside Wesley Cottage have now been repaired. With regard to the Freight Survey, two points are now being analysed. There is disappointing news about the installation of the reactive signs at the pinch point in the High Street, this is unlikely to happen until after the new contractor is in place in April. On the question of dog fouling, Dog Wardens are unable to issue penalty notices on unadopted roads; the Dog Warden can visit and talk to the dog owner, and also put up signs. The CATG has proposed the road safety problems of Bollands Hill and Turnpike (A365) as two areas in Seend for consideration, alongside 32 others in Wiltshire; two areas will be selected and investigated. The date of the next Area Board meeting has been changed from 10th to Wednesday 24th February (noted on the website). The Melksham Campus is going ahead in the next 2-2½ years. The facilities at Woolmore Farm for football and rugby should be completed by the summer. The campus will comprise a swimming pool to ASA gala standard, sports hall, gym and fitness suite, together with the Town Hall, Assembly Hall and Library. Work on the Market Place will commence in April next year. There will also be a Doctors Surgery and facilities for cricket, tennis, outdoor bowls and a skate park.

Nothing has been heard recently from our Neighbourhood Police. Mrs Heatley agreed to take on the role of liaison with the Police.

Mark Evans – Canal & River Trust

The Chairman welcomed Mark Evans, Waterway Manager at the Canal & River Trust. The Chairman outlined to Mr Evans the concerns of the Parish Council that the C&RT receive money from canal users, but do not provide amenities in the form of car parking. This has resulted in an increasing number of vehicles being parked in three areas of Seend around the access points to the K&A Canal, but in particular by the Barge Inn, Seend Cleeve and Spout Lane, where the overcrowded parking is a hazard, as it was unlikely that emergency vehicles would be able to access properties in Spout Lane; this despite additional car parking being installed by the Parish Council. Mr Evans explained the concept of continuous cruising on the canal network, which meant that boats could stop for up to 14 days and then move to a different area. The canal is being used as a place to live (not just for leisure), the annual licence is less than £1K. They have a number of enforcement officers on the canal who note when boats park. The money obtained from licences is used for the upkeep of the canal. The C&RT does not own land, and there are no plans to provide parking facilities at the moment. The moorings in Seend are visitor moorings, intended for use for up to 14 days.

Cllr Seed said that, if people are living on the canal, have jobs nearby and send their children to the local school, the C&RT have a responsibility to provide amenities, but they seem to want to ignore the problem of people and their cars. The concern is the long term parking for people living on the canal.

Mr Evans said that he would contact the Estates team and find out what the local situation is. He was trying to get as much information as possible about the perceived problems, as he would like to come back with an answer. Looking at the capacity of the canal the situation is worse in the west (between Devizes and Bath), and he wants to be supportive at a local level.

Cllr Seed said that perhaps this needs a question to the local MP, Claire Perry, who is involved with transport.

The Chairman asked Mr Evans if the C&RT could survey boaters, to ask if they own a vehicle and where is it parked? He replied that this could be a problem because of boaters' human rights, no survey has been undertaken to date.

Mr Evans was asked how the work at the bridge by The Barge is progressing. He replied that it is on schedule, the work will cost in the region of £720K.

Mr Evans was asked about the exits from the canal onto Bolland's Hill, and whether the self-closing springs on the gates could be inspected to ensure they close securely, and whether more signage could be provided.

Seend School - It was noted that Seend School has been listed in the Daily Telegraph as being in the top 10 performing schools in the country, based on last year's Year 6 SATs results. The Clerk to write and congratulate the staff and pupils on their results.

Canal bridge, Seend Cleeve – Paul Kelly, C&RT, has visited the site and the signage has been reorganised. Traffic still occasionally enters Pelch Lane from Bolland's Hill. A taxi was reported to Wilts Council for doing so, the driver has been contacted by Wilts Council and the issue has been addressed; the complaint remains on file for one year. The Clerk has been in contact with Paul Kelly on a regular basis and fed back any complaints, i.e. house splashed with mud by contractor's lorries, wall cleaned and cones supplied by contractors, also complaints about the muddy footpath (post meeting note: The C&RT has now laid down a flexible plastic pathway system across the field by the Barge). The Clerk was asked to contact the C&RT, asking them to clean Pelch Lane and Seend Cleeve, which has become muddy with contractor's vehicles.

Winter Snow Preparations – The salt spreader has now been delivered and already put to use. The Clerk has contacted the Weather Team to enquire about possible further supplies of salt.

Telephone box in Seend Cleeve – This was decorated at Christmas by Freddie & Martha Honeybone, and looked very festive. Mrs Honeybone advises she does not want material costs reimbursed. Fritz Schruoff, who lives in Seend Cleeve, has replaced the old notice board by the telephone box with a new one, and the area is very much improved. The Clerk to write and thank Mr Schruoff.

Railings at pinch point – The railings have now been replaced. The Clerk will obtain reflective tape and apply to railings.

Appointment of Trustee for The Seend Fund - Anita Shea, Secretary of the Fund, has sent information about the proposed Trustee, Jane Fishlock, who lives in Sells Green. Councillors voted unanimously to endorse Mrs Fishlock's appointment. The Clerk to advise the Fund's Secretary.

Neighbourhood Plan Update - Mrs A'Bear reported that a meeting had been held on 13th January, and the responses to Wiltshire Council's various questions were finalised. This should result in the appointment of a Link Officer who will help with managing the NP process, which will probably take about 2 years to complete. Delivering the Rural Housing Needs Survey to all households in the village is the next task, and the questionnaire has been started; volunteers would be needed to help distribute. The next slot is w/c 29th February, closing 11th April. The Parish Council will supply the parish summary.

Highways/road safety issues - Mrs A'Bear read out the mission statement from the Road Safety Group. The group wish to liaise with Steve Vaux with the preparation of a focused Residents Questionnaire in order to gain a detailed insight into their requirements together with their support. It was agreed that it would be useful in the next few months to get someone from Highways to come and look at the questions, to make sure they are realistic.

Mrs Carr said that the CATG has confirmed that both the A361 and the A365 share the same status. The Freight Survey analysis has still to be completed, it will then be sent to the Parish.

The Clerk had received information from Hamilton-Baillie Associates in Bristol, with a pdf produced for Dorset Council - *Traffic in Villages – a toolkit for Communities*.

Email received from Dr Knott, reporting that two more accidents had taken place last week, one at Bell Hill crossroads and one at Bollands Hill.

Correspondence:

Letter from Mrs Thorpe, suggesting that Councillors should submit a profile to appear in Spotlight each month. Councillors discussed, and agreed to submit a short profile of 8 or 9 lines; Mrs A'Bear to do the first one. Councillors did not agree that the profiles should appear on the PC website.

The Clerk had received an email to advise that the temporary traffic lights at Baldham Bridge would remain until parapet repair work was carried out, this would take place when the new maintenance contract commences in April.

A grant request had been received from BRAG (Bowerhill Residents Action Group), in relation to the picnic/wildlife area they had created close to the canal, specifically to assist with the costs of emptying the waste bin at the site, which is within the Seend Parish boundary. The Clerk had obtained relevant figures from MWO PC. This shows that the annual cost is £1,315, made up of Parish Caretaker visits, mileage and commercial waste collection. MWO PC gives an annual grant of £400, which pays for its public liability insurance, amongst other items. Councillors discussed this matter, but felt that having looked at the PC's financial commitments for the coming year, they are unable to help with a grant to BRAG.

The date of the next meetings are Tuesdays, 23rd February and 29th March 2016, at Seend Community Centre at 7.30 p.m.

Wiltshire Council News from Jonathon Seed

Seend is a key village amongst the seven that I represent on Wiltshire Council as part of the Division of Summerham and Seend. In recent years there has always been a lively and well run Parish Council with excellent involvement and input from residents. In this interface it is critical that the various strands of government of both local and national type work well together and engage with residents. That relationship also works both ways. Recently there has been increasing frustration that the important issue of highway safety is in danger of being undermined by a very few who find it difficult to engage in the local government processes involved and to work with those elected to represent their community. As Councillor for this area for the past seven years I do my best to represent all of those who live in the area and look after all the issues that arise, however difficult that task is made. On a more positive note I have been heavily involved in securing significant highways

improvements and additional local highways funding over many years and we look forward to the installation of the new reactive signs on the High Street over the next couple of months.

Youth services, as with all other council run services, remain under financial pressure but it is good news that the Local Youth Network for our community area is making provision for young people across the whole area. Formerly our Council youth services concentrated on towns and it really is progress that free transport is being provided for (and used by) our young village residents to enjoy youth facilities at the Canberra Youth Centre every Thursday evening. See page 26 for details.

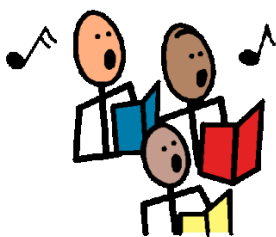
