Ron was born on 24th March 1930 at Baldham, Seend, and attended Seend school.

As a young man Ron was a great footballer, captaining Seend Village team for several years in the 1950s. Ron and Janet married on 29th September 1956 at Seend Church, setting up home at The Stocks in Seend. In due course they welcomed their children Jeff and Karen to the world.

Over the years Ron and Janet loved travelling and enjoyed holidays to the Channel Islands, Malta, and later to the USA, Spain and trips to France to visit Jeff and his family.

The passing of the years saw Ron become a grandad to Charlotte, Ellie, Cooper and Joe, and later a great grandad to Tori and Harvey.

Ron was a skilled skittler at Seend Social Club and also enjoyed playing crib later in life, and was captain of the team at the pub. He was a big fan of country music, and whilst visiting Jeff in the States was able to visit places like Nashville and the Grand Old Opry. He was an avid reader, particularly of anything to do with the American Civil War, and so enjoyed visiting battlefields and famous sites connected to that.

On 29th September last year, Ron and Janet celebrated an incredible 68 years of marriage. Sadly, the family lost Janet back in November last year.

He was very content in life, his ability to make the best of things and be comfortable in his own skin. He is deeply missed by friends and family.

Election of the Chair for the year 2025-26

Cllr Oakey nominated as chair. Proposed – Cllr Anderson-Hill. Seconded – Cllr Macalpine-Downie. The Declaration of Acceptance of Office was duly signed, and witnessed and signed by the clerk.

Election of Vice-Chair for the Year 2025-26

Cllr Macalpine-Downie nominated as vice-chair. Proposed – Cllr Oakey. Seconded – Cllr Anderson-Hill. The Declaration of Acceptance of Office was duly signed, and witnessed and signed by the clerk.

Co-opting of vacancy

Cllr Breach was co-opted on to the council and the Declaration of Acceptance of Office was duly signed, and witnessed and signed by the clerk.

Apologies : None.

Declarations of Interest: None. The clerk reminded the councillors that they have until 28th May to complete the Register of Interests on the Wiltshire Council website, and to return the elections expenses form.

Minutes of the previous meeting: To approve as a correct record the minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on 19th April 2025. Approved without amendment. Any matters arising from the minutes of the meeting held on 19th April 2025. None.

Public Participation: To enable members of the public to address the Council regarding any item on the agenda. None.

To receive any petitions or deputations: None.

Reports

To receive an update from Wiltshire Councillor – Cllr. Reay. Absent.

To receive the chair's report. Cllr Oakey reported that defibrillator had been checked and was working properly.

To receive the clerk's report. The clerk updated the meeting that after accessibility training, the website would require an accessibility audit. Clerk to investigate suppliers.

To receive the up-to-date external meetings schedule and to decide who will attend meetings. Updated.

Matters arising from previous meetings

To note volunteers meeting has no set date. Cllrs. Breach, Macalpine-Downie and Anderson-Hill to notify clerk of new volunteers meeting date.

Planning: To note the BPC Planning Schedule as at 1st May 2025. Noted.

To discuss any other applications received before the meeting. None.

Maintenance: To discuss and agree parish steward - consideration of jobs for next visit. It was agreed the clerk to advise the parish steward of clearing the front of the village hall and that the footpath and stile at The Close is mossy.

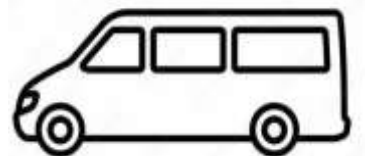
As well as our AGM in June, we will be treated to a talk by Len Murray on the bells at Seend Church, followed by a cream tea.

Thank you! Thank you to everyone who voted for me on Thursday 1 May. I am delighted to have been returned as your Wiltshire Councillor and I will do my very best over the next four years to stand up, and speak out, for residents across Devizes Rural West, and to deliver for you, and your Parish Councils.

Thank you to those who have agreed to serve as Parish Councillors and to everyone who helps to make every community in Devizes Rural West such a brilliant place to live. There were no Parish Council elections locally, and each Parish Council has at least one vacancy – additional Parish Councillors can now be co-opted, so please do contact your Parish Clerk if you are interested. I will continue to attend Parish Council meetings and to work closely with your Parish Councillors, including your Parish Clerks who are all incredibly efficient and knowledgeable about local issues. For Highways and other matters please always report on the My Wilts app or Wiltshire Council website – it is always helpful to drop your Parish Clerk an email too.

I should like to remind everyone about Wiltshire Council's Area Board Grants. Many local groups have benefited from the significant funding which is available for community organisations to ensure that our local communities are well supported. Area Board grants are split into three main funding schemes:

Community grants - capital funding to help provide facilities and equipment for projects that are important to the local community.

Youth grants - revenue funding for projects that provide positive leisure-time activities for young people aged 13-19 or up to 25 years old with special educational needs and/or disabilities.

Older and Vulnerable adult grants - revenue funding to support projects that benefit and improve older and vulnerable residents' health and wellbeing.

More information is at [Area Board Grants - Wiltshire Council](#) – the next Devizes Area Board meeting is on Monday 30 June and applications must be received at least 4 weeks before an Area Board meeting – which take place four times per year. Police and Crime Commissioner
Philip Wilkinson

There has been some encouraging news following the publication of the latest crime figures by the Office of National Statistics. In the period ending December 2024, recorded crime in Wiltshire and Swindon fell by 5.6% compared to the previous year (from 41,903 to 39,627) and Wiltshire has the lowest number of reported crimes in the country per 1,000 of population.

As a headline figure, these are good results and reflect the improvements being made by Chief Constable Roper, her senior leadership team and the frontline officers who continue to strive to provide you with the best possible service with the resources available.

Statistics only give you part of the picture, and whilst the figures tell us Wiltshire is a safe county to live in, there is a marked difference between being safe and feeling safe. Two key issues members of the public speak to me about concern police visibility and the ability to contact Wiltshire Police directly either by calling 101 or 999 or online. I support the Chief Constable's commitment to enhancing the visibility of our Neighbourhood Policing Teams by using the two new Mobile Police Stations funded by my office. From their introduction last June until the end of March 2025, they have been out in communities across Wiltshire and Swindon 226 times.

I have challenged Wiltshire Police to create a more consistent schedule, so you are fully aware of when you can speak to your local police officers about issues affecting you. We

have made significant improvements when you're calling either 999 or 101. 90% of all 999 calls are now answered in under ten seconds and I want to make further investment in the Crime and Communications Centre to improve response times and provide a more effective and timely investigative service with enhanced victim support.

Wiltshire Police continues to work hard to build trust and confidence, but we know we see under-reporting of several different crime types for a variety of reasons. I need you to report crime when and where you see it, so that when crime statistics are published, they give an accurate reflection of how you feel in your community and show that, as well as Wiltshire being a safer place to live and work, you are feeling safer.

NURTURE NATURE

We are encouraged not to mow our lawns in May to allow the wild flowers to grow and bloom. This was especially relevant this year with the Met Office informing that this is the driest spring on record. Some gardens have seen cowslips flowering early, so we are advised not to have the mower blades set too low so as to allow the wild flowers to set their seed. There are many insect hatches at this time of the season, including unwelcome greenfly and blackfly. Please don't use chemical sprays, we use washing up liquid + water in a spray bottle, which does the job, although it has to be done probably the next day, etc. Better still is to let the birds, especially the tits and some finches, major on them to feed their young. Washing up liquid won't harm them.

An enthralling sight in our garden was the discovery of a web full of a dense ball of tiny spiderlings all clustered together. They dispersed on their own gossamer lines when discovered, but soon reclustered again. These minute babies transpired to be baby garden spiders, being yellow with black on their rear ends.

Remember to keep feeders and bird baths scrupulously clean, as some of the less well-trained birds have dirty habits, and foul the water. Such contamination can infect other birds with diseases, viz bird flu. It's difficult to say at the moment how the nesting season is going, as there are many predators and scavengers about. It's doubtful that some species will even be able to keep their population numbers up. Certainly hirondine numbers are down; we have only seen two swifts and three swallows so far, with no house martins, heard no cuckoos, seen no flycatchers doing their aerial displays, no nightingales and fewer warblers singing, apart from chiff chaffs. Species numbers of garden birds are generally low, although robins appear to be doing reasonably well. Think what it will be like for birds and animal species in the many war zones around the world. A recent piece of interesting raptor news is from the peregrine falcon nest on Taunton Minster, where a last year's fledgling, now an adult, has come back to help feed



the nestlings in this year's nest. It remains to be seen whether the parents will welcome this help, or maybe chase him away as an intruder, one who is possibly looking to take over the territory. Has any reader heard of this unusual behaviour anywhere else? One can watch live feed from the webcam on the peregrine nest on Salisbury Cathedral to see how the chicks are fed and as they grow, We saw four.

We didn't have any hedgehogs using our hibernaculums, and have only seen one hedgehog so far this year – has this been the experience of readers generally?

In last year's August nature notes readers were encouraged to make time to sit in their gardens from various vantage points for half an hour or so at a time, and learn and enjoy the nature all-around them. You will be surprised at all the different activities going on throughout the year. The writer is going to do more of this, and after 25 years of writing this column for local magazines he is going to put his feet up. So, should you be interested in taking on this column please contact the Editor.

Last autumn the Government announced Envoys for Nature and Climate. We now know who they are: Rachel Kyte CMG is the Envoy for Nature and Ruth Davis OBE is the UK's Special Representative for Climate, effective from 21 October and 15 November 2024 respectively. However, we have not yet seen or heard of any pronouncements, so perhaps a new columnist could do a bit of prodding to reveal aims and objectives. For up to date bird news consult your county websites.
