The new unitary authority

Big changes are afoot in local government in Wiltshire, but it seems a lot of people are still unaware of what's going on. From April 1st, Wiltshire Council replaces Wiltshire County Council and the District Councils, including Kennet. We are told there should be no noticeable change to services in the short term. There will be local 'hubs' in Devizes, Chippenham, Salisbury and Trowbridge that will be your main points of contact rather than County Hall in Trowbridge, and area boards will be formed to deal with community matters from July 2009. Seend was destined to be part of the Trowbridge area board, but, after some dissent (see Joan Savage's letter under 'Announcements') we are to be included in the Melksham board.

Elections for the new unitary authority will not be held until 4th June. In the interim, our existing County Councillor (Mrs Pat Rugg - see inside back cover) will be our representative.

FROM ROY

We are about to celebrate Holy Week and Easter. This is the time within the Christian Year when we see God's love for the world and for each and everyone of us at its profoundest.

Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday. Jesus rides humbly into Jerusalem on a donkey. His disciples and other followers accompany him with praises and palm branches. Almost at the same time the Roman Governor, Pilate, will make his annual entry into Jerusalem for Passover (to keep the peace not the feast) — no doubt with a considerable greater show of pomp than Jesus. God's love confronts the reality of life. Our conflicts, our economic downturn, our environmental profligacy are faced off with God's love that seeks peace, justice and wholeness.

On Maundy Thursday, God's love becomes intimate. Jesus kneels to wash his disciple's feet. It's a reversal of the time earlier in the week when a woman disciple washes Jesus' feet with costly perfume. God's love is for me. I can let God minister to my need whatever it is.

On Good Friday, Jesus dies cruelly on the cross in deep darkness. Jesus and the world appear abandoned to their fate. Can we still speak of God's love? Only, I believe, falteringly, as out of our darkest experiences, out of our experience of God's absence, we discover that there is nothing can separate us from God's love because Christ has been there before us.

Easter Sunday sees Christ bounding free. Death cannot hold him. Our churches are filled with the praise of alleluias. God's love is liberated to find its way to every time, every place, every heart. Nothing can hold it back.

THE 100+ CLUB 2009-10: WHAT IS IT. AND WHY SHOULD I JOIN?

The 100+ Club is a village lottery, set up many years ago to raise funds to support the upkeep of the village-owned Lye Recreation Field and Pavilion. Membership costs £15 per person per year, and

is open to anybody in the village – or out of it; your money is just as good, no matter where you live! And last year - 2008/2009 - we raised £1224 for the Lye Field, £1010 in donations and £214 in Gift-Aid payments.

In addition to the contribution to the Lye Field, an equally important aspect of the Club is the re-distribution of over £2000 back to the subscribers as **prizes** via 12 monthly prize draws. At 11 of these draws, there were 6 prizes on offer: £35, £30, £25, £20, £15 and £10, but at the Christmas draw, there were 13 prizes, starting with a first prize of £100 and totalling over £450! Since 2002, membership has increased from 142 to 202, and in this period more than 160 members have won at least once, so you can see that the odds of winning are pretty high.

Why you should join: Principally, to support the Lye Field, which together with the Pavilion is owned by the village – that means you and me - for the use and enjoyment of everyone in the village. The upkeep is managed by volunteers who give their time and expertise free, but materials and equipment need to be paid for. Joining the 100+Club is therefore a very good way to support a fabulous amenity, while at the same time giving yourself a sporting chance of recouping your stake – or even more! How often in life does this happen? Anyone can apply for a subscription, and you can buy as many subscriptions as you like – the more you have, the better your chances of winning, and the more support we receive. Membership runs from May 1st to April 30th each year.

Application to subscribe: Application forms containing **Gift-aid certificates** are included in this month's Spotlight, so sign up now and return the form to me. Last year we reached – and surpassed - 200 members, and we must retain at least that number, so make sure you **join our Club!**

Fete-Volunteers: It can't have escaped your notice that each year we have a village Fete and each year we make an appeal for volunteers. Last year the 100+ Club application form included a Fete-volunteer section as a tear-off strip, and more than 30 of you signed up to help out on the day, an absolutely wonderful response which assisted the Fete organisers immensely. Once again we have included the sign-up slip, so again you have the opportunity to add your name to the list of helpers by completing the strip and returning it me. I will then pass it on to the Fete Committee. The Seend Fete is a fantastically successful affair, but it does require a lot of support. Please think about providing some of it.

MOTHERS' UNION: SEEND AND BULKINGTON BRANCH

In 1633 many of the villagers of Oberammergau in Bavaria were spared when a plague brought death to neighbouring settlements. In thanksgiving to God for this deliverance the villagers made a vow that every ten years they would re-enact the story of the passion. they have done so ever since. One regular visitor since 1990 has been Rev Maureen Allchin who spoke to our branch meeting on February 18th.



The Passion Play has grown in influence and now takes place in a purpose built arena, where the auditorium is covered but the stage is open to the weather. An election is held to choose the people who will play the main parts. The whole community is involved; either in the cast, the chorus or in the task of providing lodging and food for the vast number of visitors who come to witness the play from all over the world. For a village with a population of about 4,000 this is a monumental task.

The value of the play for those who watch it is in seeing the unfolding of the events of the Crucifixion. The actors speak in German but the programmes are available in many different languages. The play, which lasts for six hours, has a break for refreshments. For those who attend it is a pilgrimage, whilst for the villagers it is a vow fulfilled.

SEEND AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB

Well, I had written a highly amusing report about members who think politics is more important than gardening and elected to go to another meeting rather than Gardening Club, therefore missing the best speaker of the year. However I am now told that there were only four of you so I have had to re-write!

David Haycroft was a teacher and his talk on pelargoniums reflected his training and expertise. I might add that he trained for more than six months. David gave up teaching 20 years ago to start a fuschia and pelargonium nursery in his back garden and is obviously a very contented man. He gave us a carefully balanced mixture of talk, slides and demonstrations, starting with a potted (ho ho) biography, going on to a description of the different kinds of pelargonium and finishing with excellent demonstrations.

We saw slides of his very tidy nursery consisting of a potting shed, 2 big greenhouses and a poly-tunnel, all packed with plants of various sizes grown from cuttings taken from his own plants. He then illustrated the different kinds of pelargonium; zonal with leaf markings, regal, mostly conservatory plants as they hate getting wet, angels, smaller, mostly pink or purple or white, ivv**leaved** used in hanging baskets as they trail and lastly **scented leaved** with smaller flowers. Ivy leaved pelargoniums apparently make large plants if trained up a south facing wall, so I will be trying that this year in my front garden. Cuttings can be taken in the Autumn if you have heated greenhouses, otherwise Spring is the best time and David went on to demonstrate how to take cuttings and how to refresh and re-pot a plant that has been over-wintered. We were all most impressed by his very nifty way of potting up cuttings and potting on, which is very simple and easy when you know how. Those of us there, who are entering the Gardening Club pelargonium class in the flower show, now feel we have a distinct advantage and will probably keep the secrets to ourselves. Sue Jones will have the plug plants for sale at the AGM but you do need to order them from her now if you have not already done so.

It is our **AGM on 14th April** so we are asking for contributions of finger food to help the evening along. We have offers already but could do with more. Contact Sue Jones with any queries. Entertainment will be provided afterwards by Wafaa who will be demonstrating belly dancing.

Down the Drains in Bulkington

Following the flooding in December, when houses in the High Street were inundated with water from the heavy overnight rains, the Parish Council responded quickly with a campaign to persuade those responsible for highway and land drainage to take action to prevent the likelihood of further flooding in the village. Responses were as follows:

- surveys of road and outlying land drainage systems were carried out by engineers from District and County Councils
- land owners responsible for ditches were contacted
- County Highways unblocked a large drain running north from the High Street using high pressure jetting
- gully cleaning and road sweeping were carried out throughout the village.

At a joint parish meeting with Keevil Parish Council to discuss the flooding in both villages, and attended by Land and Highways drainage engineers, Wessex Water sewerage engineer, and supported by Wilts County Councillor Julie Swabey and Kennet District Councillor Jonathon Seed, it was established that the County Council is contracted to deliver an annual highways drainage cleansing service to the Parish. However due to a shortfall in resources following widespread flooding throughout the County, this had not been delivered in Bulkington in time to prevent local flooding. The meeting also served to identify a need for a major drainage survey to establish the condition of the drainage system in the village, and this was agreed to be tabled by the Highways Department for the next financial year.

To improve our knowledge of the village drains and understand some of the key issues involved in their maintenance, the Parish Council has put together a local plan showing the various ditches, culverts and drains together with details of the riparian owners (those who own the land which carries drainage and other waterways and who therefore have responsibilities for maintenance and upkeep of these), be it farms, householders or the Highways authorities. This document will shortly be available on the Bulkington Village Website at http://www.trowbridge.gov.uk/towninfo.asp?id=143. Owners of ditches and drains throughout the village are encouraged to look at this document and to be mindful of their responsibilities for maintenance and upkeep. Gardeners are asked to avoid filling ditches by putting grass cuttings/garden waste etc into them.

The village is indebted to those riparian owners who took speedy action following on from the flooding, although one such riparian farmer has caused a stir by piping and filling a main arterial ditch without the approval of the

drainage authority, for which a redress is currently being sought by the County Planning department and Environment Agency. Some riparian owners have yet to take this matter seriously, and much has still to done to improve our drainage systems to avoid a potential repeat of the December disaster.

Anyone interested in finding out more about their responsibilities and those of others in the village are encouraged to come to the Parish Council meetings or to contact Cllr. Calum Ogilvie on 01380 828202. Blocked ditches/drains can be reported to Calum or to Cllr. Tony Bradford.

All the above action has taken considerable effort by those involved and the Parish Council will continue to press the agencies and the riparian owners concerned to be diligent in their maintenance of drainage systems for the overall good of the village.

BITS AND BOBS

Summer Visitors

House Martins: These lovely migrant birds fly from Africa to nest in the British Isles, many in our area. They spend a long time making their mud nests under the eaves of houses. Please be tolerant of their building habits. The birds do not cause too much mess and they become distressed if all their hard work is destroyed. If house martins cannot raise their brood, yet another species will be endangered.



Swallows: Always return to their old nest sites, so please make access to them. If for security, access has to be shut, swallows will fly through small openings in order to reach their traditional nesting sites.

Swifts: Their nesting sites, some of which are centuries old, are fast disappearing. They require an access tunnel of at least 18" long with a small entrance hole. Swifts are believed to spend as much as nine months a year on the wing and are

known to nap whilst flying.
